doom

death, destruction, or some other terrible situation that cannot be avoided

synonym: judgment, destiny, fate

rename

to give a new name to something; to change the name of something

synonym: rebrand, rechristen, re-label

haunt

outrun

underworld

(1) god of the **underworld**, (2) criminal **underworld**The story of Orpheus and Eurydice is said to have taken place in the **underworld**, where Orpheus attempted to rescue his wife from the realm of the dead.

whimsical

eerie
