  The old-earth creationist believed God created the universe and all life on earth.

# paleoanthropology

 the branch of anthropology concerned with the study of human evolution and development through fossilized remains, genetics, and other methods

synonym: prehistoric anthropology, paleontology

(1) paleoanthropology expedition, (2) paleoanthropology museum

The study of **paleoanthropology** involves analyzing fossil remains to understand the evolution of humans.

#### adrenaline

 a substance secreted by the adrenal medulla in response to stress, which makes the heart beat faster and prepares the body to react to danger

synonym: epinephrine

(1) **adrenaline** receptor, (2) **adrenaline** addiction

The band has released a lot of **adrenaline-pumping** rock music.

#### frontline

adj. in the most critical or dangerous position; in the military line or part of an army closest to the enemy

synonym: battlefront, cutting edge

(1) **frontline** health workers, (2) at the **frontline** of the war Within days, the new aircraft was in **frontline** service.

#### irritate

v. to annoy, provoke, or cause resentment or anger in someone; to inflame or make sore

synonym: annoy, vex, bother

(1) irritate skin, (2) irritate my partner

The sound of his chewing loudly irritates me during dinner.

#### ancestor

- n. a person from whom one is descended; a forefathersynonym: forebear, forefather, progenitor
- (1) **ancestor** language, (2) earliest human **ancestor**My remote **ancestor** immigrated to the United States from Ireland in the 1800s.

akin

adj. similar or related in nature, character, or origin synonym: similar, related, alike

(1) **akin** to anger, (2) **akin** to the prior experiences Her interests are **akin** to mine.

#### escalate

v. to increase in intensity, size, or severity; to make something greater, worse, or more serious

synonym: increase, intensify, expand

(1) **escalate** into a major international incident, (2) to **escalate** 

The situation quickly **escalated** and turned violent.

#### detest

v. to feel intense hatred or aversion towards someone or something; to dislike or despise greatly

synonym: hate, loathe, despise

(1) detest violence, (2) detest being late

I **detest** the way people are quick to judge others without knowing their side of the story.

#### famine

 a severe shortage of food, often caused by drought, war, or economic reasons

synonym: hunger, starvation, drought

(1) famine relief, (2) coal famine

The severe **famine** caused by the drought has left many people without food.

#### human-made

adj. created or produced by humans; artificial synonym: artificial, unnatural, manufactured

(1) **human-made** climate change, (2) the worst **human-made** disaster

The bridge is a **human-made** structure and was built to span the river.

#### excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

# multidisciplinary

- adj. integrating or involving various academic fields or different skills in a topic or problem-solving approachsynonym: integrative, interdisciplinary
- (1) **multidisciplinary** project, (2) **multidisciplinary** analysis He adopted a **multidisciplinary** research approach to unravel complex phenomena.

# archipelago

 a group of islands, often located in a specific area or region

synonym: group of islands, island chain

(1) tropical **archipelago**, (2) volcanic **archipelago**The Philippines is an **archipelago** made up of over 7,000 islands.

#### reconnaissance

 a preliminary survey or exploration of an area, usually done to gather information or intelligence; a military mission to observe an enemy's activities and gather information

synonym: exploration, survey, examination

- (1) aerial **reconnaissance**, (2) do **reconnaissance** work The **reconnaissance** mission revealed the enemy's position.
- scout

  n. a person or group sent out to obtain information, gather intelligence, or make observations, typically in a military

context; a person or group sent out to explore or prospect for new opportunities, resources, or locations

synonym: scoutmaster, explorer, surveyor

(1) boy **scout**, (2) **scout** troop

The company sent a **scout** to explore new business opportunities in the overseas market.

#### stalk

v. to follow or track someone or something closely and quietly, usually to cause harm or surveillance; to move slowly and quietly to avoid detection; (noun) the main stem of a plant that supports leaves, flowers, and fruit; the stem or main axis of a support structure or framework

synonym: follow, creep up on, (noun) stem

(1) stalk of celery, (2) stalk from the room

The hunter quietly **stalked** the deer for hours before taking the shot

#### doable

adj. possible to do; capable of existing, taking place, or proving true

synonym: realizable, accomplishable, achievable

(1) make a **doable** plan, (2) **doable** in daily life This project is **doable** despite the tight schedule.

# dolphin

 a marine mammal that typically has a beaklike snout, a streamlined body, and flippers and that feeds on fish and squid

synonym: porpoise, cetacean, marine mammal

(1) **dolphin** show, (2) **dolphin-watching** tour
The large group of **dolphins** swam gracefully in the ocean, jumping out of the water now and then.

#### cockroach

 a flat, brown or black, chiefly nocturnal insects sometimes found in the home

synonym: roach

cockroach killer, (2) have a cockroach phobia
 Cockroaches sometimes cause allergic reactions in humans.

# infestation

 n. the presence or invasion of a large number of harmful or undesirable pests, parasites, or microorganisms in a specific area or host

*synonym*: plague, invasion, swarm

(1) **infestation** with a parasite, (2) flea **infestation**The hotel had an **infestation** of bed bugs, which required a professional exterminator.

moan

v. to make a low, prolonged sound of pain, grief, or sexual pleasure; to complain about something

*synonym*: groan, sigh, lament

(1) **moan** the current situation, (2) **moan** with pleasure She **moaned** in pain as the doctor examined her injury.

#### contend

- v. to struggle to win or surmount something synonym: compete, oppose, argue
- (1) **contend** that tobacco is nonaddictive, (2) **contend** for a championship

Tobacco companies have long contended that their product

is not addictive.

### discotheque

a nightclub or restaurant where recorded music is played, and people dance

synonym: nightclub, dance club, disco

(1) discotheque party, (2) discotheque scene

He couldn't wait to hit the **discotheque** and dance the night away.

#### deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular way synonym: believe, consider, suppose
- (1) **deem** socially responsible, (2) **deem** wrong or inappropriate

Regarding earthquakes, some commercial buildings were **deemed** unsafe.

#### unveil

v. to reveal or make something publicly known, especially for the first time

synonym: reveal, uncover, expose

(1) **unveil** a monument, (2) **unveil** a comprehensive plan The company plans to **unveil** its new product at the trade show next week.

#### empower

- v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle
- (1) **empower** my life, (2) **empower** the secretary to do the same

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

## reptile

 a cold-blooded animal that has dry, scaly skin and lays eggs on land, such as snakes, lizards, and turtles
 synonym: lizard, serpent, snake

(1) reptile exhibition, (2) fossil reptile

Alligators are a type of **reptile** that live in swamps and rivers.

# anthropology

- n. the scientific study of humanity, concerned with human behavior, human biology, cultures, societies, and linguistics in both the present and past, including past human species
- (1) social **anthropology**, (2) **anthropology** of religion The areas of **anthropology** and psychology are significantly related to one another.

### storytelling

- n. the act or art of narrating or writing storiessynonym: narrating, relating, recounting
- (1) **storytelling** performance, (2) courtroom **storytelling** She was skilled in **storytelling** techniques, such as using different voices for other characters.
