## biology

- the scientific study of life and the natural processes of living things

## paleoanthropology

 the branch of anthropology concerned with the study of human evolution and development through fossilized remains, genetics, and other methods

## nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

## geography

## explorer

 a person who travels to places where no one or few people have been before to find out what is there

synonym: adventurer, trailblazer, scout

#### fossil

 any preserved remains, impression, or trace of any once-living thing that has become hard and turned into rock

synonym: relic, remnant, antediluvian

#### hunt

v. to go after and try to catch wild animals to kill them for food, sport, or profit

#### cave

 a large hole in the side of a hill, cliff, mountain, or under the ground

## dispute

## territory

## threat

#### warn

limb

## tragedy

## planet

## definitely

## fascinating

## undergraduate

a student who is studying for their first degree at a university or other higher education institution

#### homosexual

## sapiens

## feat

*n.* a notable or impressive achievement, especially one that requires great skill or bravery

#### ancestor

## discovery

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

## exciting

adj. causing a lot of interest or excitement synonym: exhilarating, stimulating, thrilling

## instability

## humanitarian

## desperate

## highlight

## proximity

 the state or quality of being near or close to something or someone in distance or time

synonym: nearness, closeness, vicinity

(1) **proximity** sensor,, (2) geographical **proximity**The **proximity** of the two cities makes it easy to travel between them.

## biodiversity

- the number and variety of plants and animals that exist in a particular area or the world and make a balanced environment
- (1) **biodiversity** conservation, (2) loss of **biodiversity** The country was instrumental in promoting the **biodiversity** treaty.

## incredibly

adv. in a way that is very difficult to believe; exceedingly or extremely

synonym: enormously, exceptionally, extraordinarily

(1) **incredibly** cheerful character, (2) get **incredibly** insecure

Several cities are experiencing **incredibly** high unemployment rates.

#### environment

n. the natural world such as air, water, and land in which humans, animals, and plants live

synonym: atmosphere, surroundings, climate

#### climate

 the weather in a particular location averaged over some long period

*synonym*: atmosphere, weather, environment

#### dawn

n. the time of day when the sun's light starts to show in the sky

synonym: daybreak, sunrise, advent

## multidisciplinary

- adj. integrating or involving various academic fields or different skills in a topic or problem-solving approachsynonym: integrative, interdisciplinary
- (1) **multidisciplinary** project, (2) **multidisciplinary** analysis He adopted a **multidisciplinary** research approach to unravel complex phenomena.

## archipelago

 a group of islands, often located in a specific area or region

synonym: group of islands, island chain

(1) tropical **archipelago**, (2) volcanic **archipelago**The Philippines is an **archipelago** made up of over 7,000 islands.

#### camel

- a cud-chewing mammal used as a draft or saddle animal in desert regions
- (1) **camel** hair, (2) ride a **camel** A **camel** has a hump on its back.

#### conduct

- to organize and carry out a particular activity synonym: behave, lead, carry on
- (1) conduct a background check, (2) conduct research

Police will **conduct** random breath testing for drunk driving.

## attempt

an act or effort of trying to do something, especially something difficult

synonym: endeavor, effort, try

(1) the **attempt** to rescue the hostages, (2) a reckless attempt

The third **attempt** was far more successful.

## desperately

adv. in a way that shows a lack of hope and a willingness to do anything because of the problematic situation; with great urgency

synonym: urgently, perilously, seriously

(1) desperately anxious, (2) desperately ill patient The baby clung **desperately** to her mother.

#### reconnaissance

a preliminary survey or exploration of an area, usually n. done to gather information or intelligence; a military mission to observe an enemy's activities and gather information

synonym: exploration, survey, examination

- (1) aerial **reconnaissance**, (2) do **reconnaissance** work
- The **reconnaissance** mission revealed the enemy's position.

#### scout

a person or group sent out to obtain information, gather intelligence, or make observations, typically in a military context; a person or group sent out to explore or prospect for new opportunities, resources, or locations

synonym: scoutmaster, explorer, surveyor

(1) boy **scout**, (2) **scout** troop

The company sent a **scout** to explore new business opportunities in the overseas market.

## expedition

- n. a journey or voyage for a specific purposesynonym: journey, trip, voyage

stalk

synonym: follow, creep up on, (noun) stem

doable

adj. possible to do; capable of existing, taking place, or proving true

synonym: realizable, accomplishable, achievable

deputy

- n. a person who is appointed as the substitute of another and given the power to do something instead of another synonym: aide, assistant, appointee
- a deputy governor,
   deputy attorney general
   she left the decision to her deputy

governor

 the person who holds the highest executive office in a state or province

synonym: administrator, executive, leader

(1) **governor** general, (2) a prefectural **governor**The state **governor** visited the affected areas and promised to aid the victims.

#### cement

v. make fast as if with cement; (noun) a building material that is a powder made of a mixture of calcined limestone and clay, used with water, sand, and small stones to make concrete

synonym: adhesive, glue

(1) **cement** a close relationship, (2) **cement** blend They are eager to **cement** a positive reputation.

## cargo

- n. the goods carried by ship, aircraft, or other vehiclessynonym: shipment, freight, burden
- (1) plenty of **cargo** space, (2) unload the **cargo** During the war, many **cargo** ships were converted into battleships.

## pirate

 n. (especially in the past) a person who attacks and robs ships at sea

## dolphin

The large group of **dolphins** swam gracefully in the ocean, jumping out of the water now and then.

## straight

adj. extending or moving in one direction without bending or curving; having no deviations

## genuine

adj. real and exactly; not pretended; sincerely felt or expressed

synonym: actual, honest, unpretending

## cockroach

 a flat, brown or black, chiefly nocturnal insects sometimes found in the home

*synonym*: roach

cockroach killer, (2) have a cockroach phobia
 Cockroaches sometimes cause allergic reactions in humans.

## infestation

 n. the presence or invasion of a large number of harmful or undesirable pests, parasites, or microorganisms in a specific area or host

*synonym*: plague, invasion, swarm

(1) **infestation** with a parasite, (2) flea **infestation**The hotel had an **infestation** of bed bugs, which required a professional exterminator.

#### intense

adj. (especially of a feeling) very strong; extremely sharp or severe

synonym: extreme, fierce, harsh

(1) **intense** heat, (2) develop **intense** itching That statement by the prime minister drew **intense** international criticism.

## deck

 a flat surface that is usually made of wood or other material and is attached to a building, vehicle, or other structure

synonym: platform, veranda, patio

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(1) deck chairs, (2) hands on deck

She sat on the ship's **deck**, watching the sunset over the ocean.

#### moan

v. to make a low, prolonged sound of pain, grief, or sexual pleasure; to complain about something

*synonym*: groan, sigh, lament

(1) **moan** the current situation, (2) **moan** with pleasure She **moaned** in pain as the doctor examined her injury.

## platform

n. the raised flat space close to the track at a train station where passengers get on or off the train; (technology) a computational or digital environment in which a piece of software is executed

synonym: stage, podium, forum

(1) an arrival **platform**, (2) a digital **platform** for enterprise The speaker mounted the **platform** and started to speak.

#### contend

- v. to struggle to win or surmount something
- synonym: compete, oppose, argue
- (1) **contend** that tobacco is nonaddictive, (2) **contend** for a championship

## possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood

## discotheque

 a nightclub or restaurant where recorded music is played, and people dance

#### all-out

 adj. characterized by complete or maximum effort or intensity; lacking any restraint or reserve; done with great commitment or enthusiasm

synonym: full-scale, maximum, complete

He gave it his **all-out** effort in the race and won first place.

## jungle

 an area of tropical forest where in which trees and plants grow very thickly


