alienated

paranoia

- a mental condition characterized by delusions of persecution, unwarranted jealousy, or exaggerated self-importance, typically compounded by feelings of anxiety or irritability
- synonym: suspicion, mistrust, delusions
- (1) encourage **paranoia**, (2) suffering from **paranoia**His **paranoia** about being followed made him constantly look over his shoulder.

sabotage

n. the deliberate and malicious damage, destruction, or disruption of equipment, machinery, or other property, often by someone with a particular agenda or motive; the subversion of an organization or institution by secret agents or spies

synonym: sabotage, subversion, destruction

(1) act of sabotage, (2) sabotage mission

The **sabotage** of the factory's equipment caused significant damage.

traitor

n. a person who betrays someone or something, such as a friend, cause, or principle, to which they had previously been loyal; a person who commits treason against their country or sovereign

synonym: betrayal, turncoat, renegade

(1) political **traitor**, (2) notorious **traitor**

The government branded him a **traitor** after he leaked classified information to the press.

confiscate

v. to seize, take or appropriate something by authority, often as a penalty for breaking laws or rules

synonym: seize, take, expropriate

(1) **confiscate** drugs, (2) **confiscate** property

The security officer had to **confiscate** the weapon from the suspect.

detain

 to keep someone in official custody; to prevent them from leaving

synonym: hold, keep, detainment

(1) **detain** a terrorist, (2) **detain** for investigation The police **detained** the suspect for questioning.

curfew

 a regulation requiring people to be off the streets and indoors at a specified time, especially at night, typically imposed during a period of emergency or unrest

synonym: time limit, restriction

(1) curfew law, (2) teenage curfew

The city imposed a **curfew** to reduce crime and keep citizens safe.

proclamation

n. an official announcement or statement

synonym: announcement, declamation, edict

(1) proclamation of innocence, (2) nullify a proclamation

The king made a proclamation declaring war on the

neighboring country.

forbid

- to order somebody not to do something, especially officially; to keep something from happening or arising synonym: prohibit, ban, outlaw
- (1) **forbid** smoking in public areas, (2) **forbid** the use of chemical weapons

God **forbid** you should regret your marriage.

makeshift

adj. serving as a temporary substitute or solution; improvised *synonym*: improvised, temporary, ad-hoc

(1) makeshift shelter, (2) a makeshift solution The team set up a **makeshift** tent for shelter during the storm.

fairground

a large outdoor area or venue used for entertainment and amusement, typically including rides, games, and food concessions

synonym: carnival, amusement park, festival

(1) fairground games, (2) children's fairground The annual **fairground** attractions drew huge crowds of visitors from all over the state.

racetrack

- a circular or oval-shaped track or course used for racing events, typically involving horses, cars, or other vehicles synonym: speedway, circuit, course
- (1) oval racetrack, (2) motorcycle racetrack The professional racecar driver sped around the racetrack at lightning speed.

barrack

to provide accommodations or housing, often for military personnel or sports teams; to spur on or encourage especially by cheers and shouts; (noun) a large building or group of buildings that provide temporary housing for soldiers or other military personnel

synonym: house, lodge, cheer

(1) **barrack** room, (2) **barrack** the opposing team

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The soldiers were instructed to **barrack** in the buildings until further notice.

ensue

v. to happen or follow as a result or consequence of something

synonym: follow, occur, result

(1) **ensue** within a few years, (2) predict what will **ensue** A power outage **ensued** after the storm knocked out the electricity.

desolate

adj. deserted, barren, or lonely; causing a feeling of sadness or hopelessness

synonym: barren, stark, uninhabited

(1) a desolate scene, (2) desolate moon

The deserted island was **desolate** and uninhabited.

incarcerate

 to put or keep somebody in prison or in a place from which they cannot escape

synonym: confine, detain, imprison

(1) **incarcerate** the murderer, (2) **incarcerate** her for life He was **incarcerated** for the duration of the war.

hasty

adj. done or acting with excessive speed or urgency and without sufficient thought or consideration

synonym: rushed, impulsive, prompt

overcrowded

relocate

recreate

semblance

synonym: appearance, facade, imitation

unavoidable

adj. impossible to avoid or evade; inevitablesynonym: inevitable, inescapable, certain

(1) an **unavoidable** accident, (2) under **unavoidable** circumstances

There are now fears that war is **unavoidable**.

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular

outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

quake

- v. to shake or vibrate violently and for a short time synonym: shake, trembler, tremor
- (1) **quake** in his boots, (2) **quake** with cold The earth began to **quake**, and he knew he had to leave the building immediately.

unconstitutional

 adj. not in accordance with the constitution (= the set of fundamental principles or established precedents) of a country or state
