ornithology

- the scientific study of birds, including their behavior, anatomy, physiology, and ecology
- synonym: birdwatching, avian studies, ornithomancy
- (1) **ornithology** club, (2) **ornithology** conference The **ornithology** department at the local university has state-of-the-art facilities for the study of birds

sect

- a group of people who follow a particular religious or philosophical belief system, especially one that is regarded as outside the norm or mainstream
- synonym: group, faction, cult
- (1) sect beliefs, (2) secret sect

The minority **sect** believed in a set of unconventional religious practices.

reclassify
