#### interspace

 the space between objects or parts, especially between two closely positioned objects; an interval or gap between two things

synonym: gap, interval, space

The surgeon made an incision in the **interspace** between two ribs to access the patient's lungs.

## palindrome

n. a word, phrase, or sequence of characters that reads the same backward as forward, such as "racecar" or "level"; (of medicine and genetics) a sequence of DNA or RNA that is the same when read from 5' (five prime, denoting ends of DNA or RNA) to 3' on one strand and from 5' to 3' on the complementary strand

synonym: word palindrome, reversible, mirror-image word

- (1) **palindrome** phrase, (2) **palindrome** number The word "deified" is an example of a **palindrome**, where it reads the same backward as it does forward.

synonym: cut, hack, slice

#### scout

chop

n. a person or group sent out to obtain information, gather intelligence, or make observations, typically in a military

context; a person or group sent out to explore or prospect for new opportunities, resources, or locations

synonym: scoutmaster, explorer, surveyor

typo

- n. a mistake made in typing or the reproduction of a text synonym: error, mistake, misprint

snip

 to trim or cut something, especially with scissors or shears; to remove a small part or piece from something with a quick cut or slice

synonym: clip, trim, cut

I must **snip** the loose thread on my shirt before it becomes a bigger problem.

inject

to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

synonym:

shoot, infiltrate, insinuate

#### nuclease

- an enzyme that breaks down nucleic acids, such as DNA and RNA, into smaller fragments by breaking the bonds between nucleotides

## homologous

 adj. having the same or similar structure, position, or function, particularly in different species or organisms; related by common ancestry

synonym: corresponding, analogous, similar

## blueprint

 a photographic print of an early plan for a building or machine

cyst

 a sac, cavity, or abnormal growth in the body that is typically filled with fluid or semisolid material; usually benign but can also be cancerous and require treatment

synonym: abscess, sac, lump

The patient was sent for an X-ray to determine the cause of the **cyst** in her abdomen.

#### **fibrosis**

 the formation of excess fibrous connective tissue in an organ or tissue, often associated with inflammation, scarring, or injury; a pathological condition that can affect various organs and tissues of the body, leading to impaired function and potential organ failure

synonym: scarring, hardening, fibrotic disease

(1) fibrosis diagnosis, (2) pulmonary fibrosis

#### sickle

 a tool consisting of a short curved blade with a handle, used for cutting grass or grain; also a symbol associated with harvest or death
