synonym: ignorant, unaware, unenlightened

He made an **uninformed** decision based on hearsay instead of facts.

#### condom

 a thin rubber or plastic sheath worn over the penis during sexual intercourse to prevent pregnancy or the transmission of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) between partners

synonym: prophylactic, rubber, sheath

(1) condom brand, (2) safe condom use

Using a **condom** during sexual activity is one of the most effective ways to prevent unwanted pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections.

#### cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- (1) cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounderHe is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

#### contraceptive

adj. relating to a method or object used to prevent pregnancy; serving to prevent or reduce the likelihood of conception

synonym: preventive, prophylactic, antifertility

(1) **contraceptive** measures, (2) hormonal **contraceptive** The **contraceptive** patch offers a convenient and effective method of birth control.

#### quitter

 a person who gives up easily or does not have the determination to finish what they have started

synonym: coward, deserter, surrender

(1) easy quitter, (2) serial quitter

He was labeled as a **quitter** after he abandoned the project halfway.

#### contraception

the use of methods or devices to prevent pregnancy,
 typically by blocking fertilization or implantation of a

fertilized egg, which options include contraceptives, condoms, intrauterine devices (IUDs), and sterilization procedures

(1) hormonal **contraception**, (2) **contraception** pills Condoms are a common method of **contraception** that both men and women can use.

#### derail

v. to cause a train or tram to run off the tracks accidentally; to run off or leave the rails accidentally

synonym: crash, wreck, thwart

(1) **derail** the recovery, (2) **derail** an argument The train **derailed** because a cow was standing on the tracks.

#### trajectory

the curved path followed by an object moving through space

synonym: course, curve, orbit

(1) career **trajectory**, (2) a **trajectory** missile

The company has shown an excellent growth **trajectory** over the years.

#### unintentional

adj. not done or made on purpose; accidental synonym: accidental, unforeseen, spontaneous

(1) avoid **unintentional** harm, (2) **unintentional** insult The mistake was **unintentional** and made in good faith.

#### deceptive

adj. tending to mislead or deceive either deliberately or inadvertently; causing one to believe what is not true or fail to believe what is true

synonym: misleading, trickery, fraudulent

(1) **deceptive** practices, (2) appearances are **deceptive**The politician's statements were found to be **deceptive** and not based on fact.

#### empower

v. to give someone the power or authority to do something synonym: authorize, endow, entitle (1) **empower** my life, (2) **empower** the secretary to do the same

The company **empowered** employees to buy low-price items without approval to achieve efficient purchasing.

#### unconscionable

 adj. not guided by conscience; unprincipled; unreasonable; excessively or shockingly excessive, unreasonably harsh or severe

synonym: unscrupulous, immoral, unethical

(1) unconscionable behavior, (2) unconscionable decision

It is **unconscionable** that some companies exploit their workers for profit.

roe

the eggs or egg-filled ovaries of female fish, typically used as a food item

synonym: fish eggs, caviar, spawn

(1) **roe** production, (2) salmon **roe**

#### opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical
