#### tremble

#### priceless

#### worthless

adj. having no value or usefulness; not worth consideringsynonym: valueless, useless, pointless

(1) worthless stock, (2) worthless coin

The product was found to be **worthless** as it failed to meet the customer's expectations.

#### discourage

v. to make someone lose confidence, enthusiasm, or less willing to do something

synonym: dishearten, depress, demoralize

(1) **discourage** customers, (2) **discourage** bacterial growth His parents tried to **discourage** him from becoming an artist.

#### autobiography

a written account of someone's own life, written by that person

*synonym*: bio, life story, biography

(1) **autobiography** of his early life, (2) fictionalized **autobiography** 

She wrote an **autobiography** detailing her journey from poverty to success.

#### indomitable

adj. impossible to defeat, discourage or subdue; unconquerable; unyielding in spirit

synonym: unbeatable, invincible, unconquerable

(1) **indomitable** determination, (2) **indomitable** courage Despite facing many challenges, her **indomitable** spirit helped her overcome them all.

#### commute

v. to regularly travel a particular journey, especially between one's home and place of work; (noun) a regular journey of some distance to and from your place of work

synonym: travel, journey, trip

(1) **commute** to work, (2) daily **commute** 

He had to **commute** two hours each way to get to work.

#### huddle

v. to crowd or press closely together; cuddle

synonym: cluster, crowd, group

(1) **huddle** in a temporary shelter, (2) **huddle** around the open fire

The children **huddled** together for warmth in the cold winter storm.

#### shawl

 a piece of fabric or clothing worn as a covering or adornment around the neck, shoulders, or head; a wrap or cape-like garment

synonym: wrap, stole, pashmina

(1) shawl collar, (2) silk shawl

My grandmother wore her favorite knitted **shawl** to keep warm on the chilly autumn evening.

#### confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

#### alienated

- adj. feeling isolated, estranged, or disconnected from others, often due to a sense of difference or lack of belongingsynonym: isolated, estranged, disconnected
- (1) **alienated** from my parents, (2) become **alienated**The new employee felt **alienated** from the rest of the team, as they didn't try to include him in their conversations.

#### intimidate

v. to make someone fearful or uneasy so that they will do something that you want them to do

*synonym*: frighten, threaten, terrify

(1) **intimidate** an opponent, (2) effectively **intimidate** a thief The boss tried to **intimidate** his subordinate with threats.

#### awaken

- v. to stop sleeping or to cause someone to stop sleeping synonym: rouse, arouse, revive
- awaken at daybreak, (2) awaken a child
   The friend's death awakens them.

#### institutionalize

 to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.) synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

#### opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### laborer

 a person who works hard physically, typically doing unskilled or manual labor; a worker or employee who performs physically demanding tasks

synonym: worker, employee, operative

(1) laborer job, (2) skilled laborer

The construction site hired many **laborers** to help with the heavy lifting.
