mammography

synonym: breast imaging, mammogram, breast X-ray

app

 (abbreviation for application) software designed to run on smartphones and other mobile devices or inside a web browser on a PC

synonym: application, software

crowdsourcing

- n. the practice of obtaining needed services, ideas, or content by enlisting the services of a large number of people, either paid or unpaid, typically via the internet

overt
