heartland

n. a region or area that is considered central or vital to a particular country, culture, or social or economic system, often characterized by a sense of national identity or pride and a strong attachment to tradition or values associated with that region

industrial heartland,
 American heartland
 grew up surrounded by cornfields and farms in the country's heartland.

teleport

futurist

The radical **futurist** predicted that virtual reality would become a standard in everyday life.

recycle

v. to sort and collect things to process them and produce valuable materials that can be used again

synonym: reclaim, reuse, reprocess

(1) **recycle** the cardboard boxes, (2) **recycle** milk packaging into new paper

We largely **recycle** the circuit board of cell phones because they contain a lot of valuable metals.

discontent

- dissatisfaction or unhappiness with a situation or condition; a feeling of displeasure or disapproval
- synonym: dissatisfaction, unrest, displeasure

flint

- n. a hard, gray stone that can produce sparks when struck with steel used historically to start fires; a type of microcrystalline quartz used for making tools, weapons, and jewelry

inmate

- a person who is confined to an institution such as a prison, hospital, or mental health facility
- *synonym*: prisoner, convict, detainee

reconcile

proponent

the ancient past, especially the period of classical civilization

boardroom
