treacherous

adj. that cannot be trusted; malicious; hazardous, even while seeming safe

synonym: dangerous, unfaithful, disloyal

(1) treacherous territory, (2) treacherous actDue to snow and ice, many roads have becometreacherous, and motorists are advised to travel gently.

chaotic

adj. without any order or organization; extremely disorganized, unpredictable, and confusing

synonym: disorderly, cluttered, topsy-turvy

(1) the **chaotic** economic situation, (2) **chaotic** theory Change is also occurring in Turkey as a result of **chaotic** reform.

smartphone

- a mobile phone that functions as a computer and connects to the Internet
- (1) **smartphone** app developer, (2) **smartphone** addict Internet traffic volumes have increased significantly with the advent of **smartphones**.

grind

v. to reduce something to small particles or powder by crushing or rubbing it; to work hard over a long period of time

synonym: mill, crush, grate

(1) **grind** away at my work, (2) **grind** your teeth She had to **grind** the coffee beans before making a fresh cup.

industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

bulky

adj. taking up much space or being difficult to move because of its size or weight; large and unwieldy

synonym: large, cumbersome, unwieldy

(1) bulky material, (2) bulky packaging

The **bulky** furniture made it difficult to move around the small room.

crystalline

 adj. resembling crystal in clarity, transparency, or brilliance;
 having a highly ordered and symmetrical molecular structure

synonym: crystallized, clear, transparent

(1) **crystalline** structure, (2) **crystalline** water

The geologist found a beautiful specimen of a **crystalline** mineral.

wafer

n. a thin, flat, crisp biscuit or cake, often used as a communion element in religious services; a thin slice or piece of semiconductor material used in the production of computer chips and other electronic devices

synonym: thin cake, biscuit, disk

(1) strawberry **wafer**, (2) **wafer** cleaning system
The solar panel uses high-quality silicon **wafers** to convert sunlight into electricity efficiently.

nanoscale

- adj. on a scale that can be measured in nanometres (= one billionth of a meter); on a very small scale
- (1) **nanoscale** device, (2) things at the **nanoscale**This process improves the strength of the metal by controlling the **nanoscale** lattice structure of the metal.

micron

 a unit of measurement equal to one-millionth of a meter, used for measuring the size of particles and microorganisms

synonym: micrometer

(1) **micron** measurements, (2) **micron** imaging
The width of a single human hair is around 100 **microns**.

oversimplify

- v. to describe or explain something in a way that is too simple and no longer holds true
- (1) **oversimplify** the problem, (2) **oversimplify** a complex reality

People may **oversimplify** natural phenomena due to the improved accessibility of knowledge.

etch

v. to carve, cut, or engrave (a design or text) into a hard surface; to corrode, erode or eat away at a metal surface using acid or another chemical substance to create a design or pattern

synonym: engrave, inscribe, carve

(1) **etch** a metal plate, (2) **etch** a design into wood He used a sharp tool to **etch** his initials onto the metal.

improvisation

 the act of making something up on the spot or creating or performing something without preparation

synonym: spontaneity, ad-lib, extemporization

(1) **improvisation** on stage, (2) jazz **improvisation** He created a beautiful piece of music using only **improvisation**.

mimic

v. to imitate someone's speech, movement, or behavior, especially to make others laugh

synonym: mirror, imitate, ape

(1) **mimic** a human voice, (2) **mimic** numerous instruments He is very popular at school because he can **mimic** all the teachers' accents.

repel

- v. to force an attack or attacker to withdraw or retreat synonym: turn away, fight off, force back
- repel bandits, (2) repel bad luck
 This material can repel moisture swiftly.

squirm

v. to twist, wiggle, or contort the body uncomfortably or awkwardly, often due to embarrassment, discomfort, or nervousness

synonym: squiggle, wiggle, writhe

(1) **squirm** uncomfortably, (2) **squirm** with excitement The child **squirmed** out of his mother's grasp and ran off.

symmetrical

 adj. having similarity in size, shape, and relative position of corresponding parts

synonym: harmonious, balanced, proportional

(1) **symmetrical** triangle, (2) **symmetrical** pattern This figure is **symmetrical** about the x-axis.

meander

v. to wander or roam aimlessly or leisurely; to follow a winding or circuitous course, as a river or road

synonym: wander, zigzag, twist

(1) **meander** down the river, (2) **meander** aimlessly We decided to **meander** through the park and enjoy the scenery.

fingerprint

 a unique pattern of ridges and valleys on the surface of a finger that can be used to identify a person

synonym: print, mark, impression

(1) **fingerprint** at a crime scene, (2) **fingerprint** identification

The police used a fingerprint scanner to identify the suspect.

determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

(1) environmental **determinant**, (2) a **determinant** of crop yields

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

asymmetrical

 adj. lacking symmetry or balance; unevenly or irregularly shaped; not corresponding in terms of quantity, size, or position

synonym: uneven, lopsided, crooked

(1) **asymmetrical** design, (2) **asymmetrical** haircut The **asymmetrical** shape of the vase made it unique and exciting.

cleanliness

 the state of being clean or free from dirt, dust, or foreign substances; the practice of maintaining good hygiene and cleanliness

synonym: neatness, hygiene, sanitation

(1) **cleanliness** standards, (2) **cleanliness** of the kitchen We must prioritize our workplace's **cleanliness** for our employees' safety.

microscopic

adj. tiny; exceedingly precise and detail-oriented; of or used in microscopy

synonym: infinitesimal, tiny, atomic

disrupt
