#### coercive

adj. using force, threats, or intimidation to compel someone to do something against their will or desire; related to coercion

synonym: force, compel, pressure

(1) **coercive** behavior, (2) use **coercive** measures

### falsehood

 a statement or belief that is untrue, often intentionally deceptive or misleading

synonym: lie, untruth, deception

## scalpel

wield

synonym: knife, surgical instrument, blade

#### stomp

synonym: trample, tread, dance
