#### resilient

adj. able to withstand or recover quickly from difficult conditions

synonym: robust, sturdy, tough

## breakup

the end of a relationship between persons or nations;

synonym: breakdown, divorce, separation

#### stressor

- n. something that causes stress or emotional tensionsynonym: pressure, strain, burden

## depress

v. to make someone feel sad, low in spirits, or without hope; to make markets, businesses, etc., less active synonym: sadden, discourage, deflate

# (1) depress their spirits,(2) depress crop pricesThe economic recession depressed the housing market.

### bully

 a person who uses strength or power to harm or intimidate those who are weaker; (verb) to intimidate, harass, or mistreat someone weaker or less powerful

synonym: tormentor, intimidator, aggressor

The schoolyard **bully** terrorized the other children and made their lives miserable.

#### beforehand

adv. ahead of time; in advancesynonym: in advance, preceding, earlier

(1) take a seat **beforehand**, (2) three months **beforehand**She packed her sunscreen **beforehand** to remember it on the beach trip.

#### **Alzheimer**

 a neurodegenerative disease that causes memory loss, cognitive decline, and behavioral issues; is the most common cause of dementia in older adults

synonym: dementia, memory loss, cognitive decline

(1) **Alzheimer's** brain, (2) **Alzheimer's** risk factors My grandmother has **Alzheimer's** disease requires special care and attention from her caregivers.

typhoid

 a severe bacterial infection that is typically spread through contaminated food or water; symptoms include fever, headache, muscle aches, and gastrointestinal problems

*synonym*: typhus, enteric fever

typhoid outbreak, (2) typhoid vaccination
 The doctor prescribed antibiotics to treat her typhoid symptoms.

## gunpoint

n. the point of a gun, used as a threat or in an armed robbery

synonym: point, muzzle

loot

v. steal goods from a place or person, typically during a war or riot; (noun) steal goods from a place or person, typically using force, especially in times of war or civil disorder

synonym: plunder, pillage, rob

## empathy

*n.* the ability to share another person's feelings or experiences by imagining that person's situation

*synonym*: compassion, sympathy, tenderness

## psychopharmacology

- n. the scientific study of the effects of drugs on the mind and behavior, particularly in the treatment of mental illness or disorders
