harshness

environment

introductory

adj. intended as an introduction or preliminary; serving as a base or starting point

release

- v. to set free or allow to escape from confinement synonym: free, let go, discharge

parole

 the conditional release of a prisoner before the completion of a sentence on the promise of good behavior

synonym: probation, conditional release, supervised release

counselor

 a person trained to give advice and help people deal with personal or emotional problems

synonym: advisor, consultant, therapist

encourage

v. to give someone support, confidence, or hope; to persuade someone to do or continue to do something by making it easier for them and making them believe it is a good thing to do

enroll

criminal

n. a person who has committed a crimesynonym: offender, lawbreaker, delinquent

 the quality of being fair and reasonable and treating people equally according to their due

synonym: fairness, equity, impartiality

assistant

someone who helps or supports someone else to do a iob

synonym: aide, helper, associate

(1) an unwilling **assistant**, (2) **assistant** professor An executive **assistant** director administers each branch.

district

a part of a country or town, especially one with particular features

synonym: territory, dominion, zone

(1) school districts, (2) urban districts

Since 2001, the **district** has provided training programs for automotive technicians.

psychology

- n. the scientific study of mind and behavior
- (1) **psychology** experiment, (2) **psychology** of crowd She had a master's degree in **psychology**.

assume

v. to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

(1) **assume** a lousy attitude to his boss, (2) **assume** an important role

prosecutor

 a lawyer or official who conducts legal proceedings against someone accused of a crime; a person who brings a criminal case to court on behalf of the state or government

synonym: district attorney, state attorney

session

 a formal meeting or series of meetings for the execution of a particular group's functions; a period spent doing a particular activity

pray

fellow

adj. someone who has the same job or interests as you, or is in the same class, profession, or situation as you

eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

suffer

rev

a man who is married to one's mother but is not one's biological father

shelter

 a structure built to protect from poor weather, danger, or attack:

synonym: refuge, hideout, lair

swear

to make a solemn promise or vow; to use rude or offensive language

synonym: declare, assert, curse

(1) **swear** an oath, (2) **swear** a blue streak

I swear I didn't mean to break your vase.

oath

n. a solemn promise or affirmation, often made in a formal public setting, to do something or adhere to certain principles or beliefs; a formal declaration of one's commitment to a particular course of action, organization, or duty

synonym: pledge, vow, promise

He took an **oath** to uphold the law as a police officer.

emotional

adj. relating to people's feelings

synonym: affecting, impactful, impressive

waist

laundromat

n. a self-service laundry facility where customers can wash and dry their clothes using coin-operated machinessynonym: laundry, washeteria, washhouse

nowhere

adv. not in, at, or to any place; not anywhere

confuse

v. to mistake one thing for another; to make somebody hard to understand

synonym: confound, obscure, disorient

(1) **confuse** the listener, (2) **confuse** fantasy with reality Her remarks **confused** the debate.

adrenaline

 a substance secreted by the adrenal medulla in response to stress, which makes the heart beat faster and prepares the body to react to danger

synonym: epinephrine

(1) **adrenaline** receptor, (2) **adrenaline** addiction

The band has released a lot of **adrenaline-pumping** rock music.

leap

v. to jump or spring into the air, often with the feet leaving the ground or a surface below; to move quickly or suddenly, often forward or upward

synonym: jump, bound, hop

The athlete was able to **leap** over the hurdle with ease.

ooze

v. to flow or seep out slowly, often in a thick, viscous manner; to exude or emit slowly and steadily

defend

v. to protect someone or something from attack, criticism, danger, etc.

squeeze

v. to apply pressure from two or more sides; to hold someone or something tightly in your arms, usually with fondness

synonym: compress, crush, clamp

(1) **squeeze** a lemon, (2) **squeeze** a confession She **squeezed** the toothpaste tube from the middle to get the last bit out.

trigger

- v. to make something happen suddenly; to cause something such as a device, machine, etc. to function synonym: activate, spark, drive

paralyze

v. to cause a person or part of the body to become unable to move or feel

synonym: immobilize, disable, numb

regret

v. to feel sad, repentant, or disappointed over something you have done or something you have not been able to do

synonym: apologize, deplore, lament

identity

n. the fact of being who or what somebody or something is; the features, emotions, or ideas that distinguish persons from one another

synonym: character, personality, individuality

(1) mistaken **identity**, (2) **identity** as an individual The terrorist's **identity** remains unknown.

terrifying

adj. very frightening or intimidating

synonym: frightening, intimidating, alarming

terrifying experience, (2) terrifying events
 Large earthquakes often generate terrifying tsunamis.

qualified

adj. officially recognized as having completed a training course or passed the exams that are necessary to perform a particular job

synonym: eligible, skillful, accomplished

a qualified doctor, (2) qualified in medicine
 we seek a person qualified for the post.

gradual

adj. happening slowly over a long period of time or distance;not steep or abrupt

synonym: incremental, gradational, piecemeal

(1) a **gradual** process, (2) a **gradual** change

The country experienced a **gradual** increase in population.

trap

n. a piece of equipment or hole for catching animals or people; (verb) to catch animals or people and prevent

them from escaping

synonym: catch, snare, pinfall

vicious

adj. having or showing a desire to cause harm to others; having the nature of vice

cycle

an interval during which a recurring sequence of events occurs; a bicycle or motorcycle

incarceration

- the state of being confined in prison or jail synonym: confinement, imprisonment, detention
- (1) mass incarceration, (2) incarceration rates The judge sentenced him to five years of incarceration for embezzlement.

commit

- to do something illegal or wrong synonym: engage, carry out, execute
- (1) **commit** suicide, (2) **commit** mistakes The military has **committed** an abuse of human rights.

individual

- a single person or thing, as distinct from a group *synonym*: person, being, self
- (1) a private individual, (2) individual freedom As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

emotion

 a strong feeling such as love, anger, etc. deriving from one's situation, mood, or relationships with others

synonym: feeling, sentiment, passion

(1) control my **emotion**, (2) afraid to show **emotion**Some **emotions** are common across cultures and backgrounds.

drone

 a low continuous humming noise; someone who takes more time than necessary; a pilot-less aerial vehicle that is operated by remote control

synonym: hum, whirr, idler

reprogram

- v. to modify or recreate a programsynonym: recreate, modify, revamp

ambitious

adj. having a great desire to attain achievement, power, or wealth

synonym: enterprising, challenging, earnest

motto

a phrase or slogan that expresses a guiding principle or goal

synonym: slogan, catchphrase, phrase

(1) the **motto** for safe traffic, (2) company **motto**The company's **motto** is "Innovation and Service," which is reflected in its products and customer support.

definitely

adv. without any question and beyond doubt; clearlysynonym: absolutely, certainly, indeed

(1) **definitely** become a problem, (2) say **definitely** The paper is **definitely** worth reading thoroughly.

midway

adv. in the middle of a process or journey; halfway between two points or stages

synonym: halfway, in the middle

(1) **midway** between our houses, (2) **midway** through the flight

We stopped at a restaurant **midway** through our road trip for lunch.

nick

- n. a small cut, notch, or indentation in a surface or an edge synonym: incision, dent, indentation
- (1) a **nick** on the fender of a car, (2) **nick** on my hand. The interviewer arrived in a **nick** of time.

tiptoe

n. a way of walking quietly and cautiously, with the weight balanced mainly on the balls of the feet and the heels lifted off the ground; a type of shoe or slipper that has a thin sole and is designed for quiet walking; (verb) to walk quietly and carefully, balancing on the tips of one's toes or the balls of one's feet

synonym: stealth, sneak

(1) tiptoe approach, (2) tiptoe around the issueI walked on tiptoe to avoid waking up my sleeping baby.

racial

 adj. of or related to the race (= classification of humans into groups based on physical traits or social relations)

synonym: ethnic, tribal, ethnical

bias

 a strong feeling in favor of or against one group of people, an idea, or thing, often not based on fair judgment

synonym: inclination, partiality, predilection

socialism

She researched gender bias in politics.

discriminate

v. to treat a person or particular group of people worse or better than another, especially in an unfair way; to recognize or perceive the difference between people or things

synonym: show prejudice, segregate, differentiate

- (1) discriminate against women employees,
- (2) discriminate between different things

You should not **discriminate** against minorities.

reform

 the act of improving or correcting something that is wrong or bad; a change made to correct a flaw or problem

synonym: change, modify, improve

(1) economic reform, (2) reform movement

The government is proposing a **reform** to the healthcare system to make it more accessible and affordable for all citizens.

silent

adj. without any or little sound synonym: quiet, hushed, mute

(1) **silent** reading, (2) give **silent** consent

The politician remained silent despite intense media scrutiny.

cheer

- v. to give a loud shout to show support, praise, or approval synonym: comfort, encourage, hearten
- (1) **cheer** for the home team, (2) **cheer** me up Supporters in the stands **cheered** at every goal.

eager

adj. showing enthusiasm and a strong desire or interest to do something

synonym: keen, enthusiastic, ardent

(1) eager anticipation, (2) with eager eyes

The children were **eager** to start the treasure hunt.

committed

adj. willing to put in a lot of effort, time, and energy into something; firmly believing in something

synonym: devoted, faithful, attached

(1) in a **committed** relationship, (2) strong and **committed** sales staff

Our company is strongly **committed** to meeting customers' needs.

mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

synonym: abundance, crowd, mob

(1) a **mass** of molten rock, (2) critical **mass**The **mass** of people who do not own property is politically impotent.

possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake

The **possibility** of getting the disease will drastically increase.

uncover

v. to remove the cover from something; to discover something previously unseen or hidden

synonym: disclose, reveal, unveil

(1) **uncover** a potential problem, (2) **uncover** the truth He continued his investigation and soon **uncovered** another crime.

mandatory

adj. required by a rule or law, compulsory *synonym*: compulsory, obligatory, required

(1) a mandatory clause, (2) mandatory trainingAttendance at the meeting is mandatory for all employees.

reframe

v. to reinterpret, rephrase, or redefine an issue, situation, or question in a different way

synonym: redefine, restructure, reposition

(1) **reframe** resource allocation, (2) **reframe** problem The therapist tried to **reframe** his negative thoughts.

mindset

 the established set of attitudes or fixed ideas held by someone

synonym: attitude, ethos, mentality

(1) flexible **mindset**, (2) the **mindset** in an education system

Countries whose goal is economic development often focus on fostering an entrepreneurial **mindset** in each individual.

instill

- v. to impart, introduce, or cause to be absorbed gradually synonym: implant, ingrain, inculcate
- (1) **instill** confidence, (2) **instill** medication into my eye
 The teacher attempted to **instill** the importance of hard work
 in her students.

aspiration

 a strong desire to achieve something; the action or process of drawing breath

synonym: ambition, inhalation, intake

(1) no **aspiration** for fame, (2) **aspiration** into the lungs He has an **aspiration** to become a doctor.

ambassador

 a diplomatic representative of a country who is sent to another country or international organization

synonym: envoy, diplomat, representative

(1) **ambassador** for football, (2) send an **ambassador** abroad

The **ambassador** of peace met with government officials to discuss bilateral relations.

obvious

adj. easy to see, discover or understand synonym: apparent, conspicuous, evident

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(1) **obvious** reasons, (2) his conclusion was **obvious** There are **obvious** differences between the two wine-producing regions.

transform

- v. to change in outward structure or looks;
- synonym: alter, convert, change
- (1) **transform** an education system, (2) **transform** heat into power

My father's death **transformed** my life completely.

conviction

 a strong belief or opinion, especially one that is based on principles or evidence; (criminal law) a final judgment of guilty in a criminal case and the punishment that is imposed

synonym: belief, certainty, faith

(1) moral **conviction**, (2) **conviction** for murder She spoke with **conviction** about the importance of education.

process

n. a series of actions or operations performed to achieve a particular outcome or goal; a systematic procedure or approach used to accomplish a specific task or objective; a method of treating milk to make it suitable for consumption or use in other dairy products

synonym: procedure, method, system

(1) **process** improvement, (2) decision-making **process** The **process** for applying for a visa can be lengthy and complicated.

communal

adj. belonging to or used by a group rather than individuals; for common use

synonym: collaborative, combined, collective

(1) **communal** swimming pool, (2) **communal** combination of funds

excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

rough

adj. not quite exact or correct; having or caused by an irregular surface

synonym: inelegant, coarse, barbarian

(1) **rough** and tough, (2) **rough** estimation

The vehicle bounced along the **rough** mountain road.

shock

 a strong feeling or physical reaction to a sudden and unexpected event or experience, especially something unpleasant

synonym: amazement, surprise, stunner

(1) death from shock, (2) shock-resistantHe got an electric shock at work.

temporary

adj. not lasting or be used for a very long synonym: provisional, short-term, interim

(1) a **temporary** permit, (2) **temporary** housing

id

He managed to get **temporary** jobs during the recession.

a part of the psyche that represents the unconscious desires and instincts of an individual; in psychoanalytic theory, it is believed to be the most basic and primal part of the human psyche; (also ID, short for identification) a document or card that proves a person's identity, such as a driver's license, passport, or national ID card

synonym: identity, ego, persona

(1) the **id** ego, (2) **ID** card

display

v. to exhibit or show something to others, often to attract attention or demonstrate its features, properties, or value

barrier

 a fence or other obstruction that makes it hard to move or get in; any condition that makes it difficult to make progress or to achieve an objective

genuine

adj. real and exactly; not pretended; sincerely felt or expressed

synonym: actual, honest, unpretending

empathy

n. the ability to share another person's feelings or experiences by imagining that person's situation

synonym: compassion, sympathy, tenderness

(1) full of **empathy**, (2) **empathy** for patients **Empathy** is also necessary to understand history.

couch

- n. a piece of furniture made for sitting, usually with a back and armrests, designed to seat more than one person
- synonym: sofa, settee, divan
- leather couch, (2) a couch potato

relative

adj. considered and evaluated through comparison with something else

synonym: comparative, proximate, congeneric

policy

n. a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

(1) health policy, (2) foreign policy

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

recommendation

 an official suggestion that something is good or suitable for a particular purpose or job

synonym: guidance, advice, suggestion

proposal

- n. a formal suggestion or offer, sometimes a written onesynonym: offer, suggestion, proposition

commissioner

 an official member of a government department or another organization who is responsible for controlling something or performing specific duties

synonym: administrator, agent, official

graduate

 a person who has a first degree from university or college; (verb) to complete the first course of university or college and get a degree

synonym: alumna, alum, grad

auditorium

 a room or building used for concerts, plays, or other public performances

synonym: hall, theater, amphitheater

memorable

 adj. worth remembering or likely to be remembered, especially because of being very important or remarkable

synonym: extraordinary, noteworthy, unforgettable


