exoplanet

- a planet that orbits a star outside of the solar system
- (1) the closest **exoplanet** to Earth, (2) **exoplanet** mission The **exoplanet** Kepler-186f is located 500 light-years from Earth and is believed to be habitable.

photosynthesis

- n. the process through which plants and other organisms transform light energy into chemical energy, which is then released through cellular respiration to power the organism's activities.

In **photosynthesis**, plants use carbon dioxide to feed themselves.

plop

The **recessive** gene for blue eyes is only expressed when both parents carry the gene.

colorectal

adj. relating to or affecting both the colon (= a part of the large intestine) and the rectum (= a part of the digestive system), often used to refer to medical conditions of the lower digestive system

synonym: rectal, anal, intestinal

(1) colorectal polyp, (2) colorectal surgery

A healthy diet and regular exercise can help reduce the risk of developing **colorectal** cancer.

bubo

- a swollen and painful lymph node, often caused by a bacterial infection such as the bubonic plague
- (1) lymphatic **bubo**, (2) **bubo** formation

synonym: swelling, lymph node, abscess

The patient presented with a painful right inguinal bubo.

cholera

 a severe infectious disease that causes acute diarrhea, vomiting, and dehydration, often resulting in a rapid and dangerous loss of body fluids and electrolytes

synonym: infectious disease, epidemic, plague

(1) cholera toxin, (2) cholera epidemic

The outbreak of **cholera** was a major health crisis in the 19th century.

diversify

synonym: scarring, hardening, fibrotic disease

mosquito

vial
