synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

unplanned

counterattack

formal, one-on-one combat between two people,

organelle

- a specialized subunit, usually within a cell, that has a specific function
- (1) cellular **organelles**, (2) **organelle** protein Membranes bind these **organelles** together.

stab

 to cause harm with a sharp, pointed object, such as a knife

synonym: poke, thrust, jab

(1) **stab** at the enemy with a knife, (2) **stab** in the chest He was **stabbed** many times with scissors.

rupture

 a break or tear in something, especially a bodily tissue or a physical object

synonym: fracture, break, tear

(1) a **rupture** between friends, (2) the **rupture** of a blood vessel

A fault line **rupture** can cause significant damage and destruction to surrounding areas.

smear

 to spread or apply a substance thinly and unevenly over a surface; to slander or accuse someone falsely; (noun) a mark or blot made by smudging, typically a dirty or

fibrosis

synonym: scarring, hardening, fibrotic disease
