# physics

- *n.* the science of matter and energy and their interactions
- (1) nuclear **physics**,(2) laws of **physics**He studied the **physics** of radiation.

#### nanoscale

- adj. on a scale that can be measured in nanometres (= one billionth of a meter); on a very small scale
- (1) nanoscale device, (2) things at the nanoscale This process improves the strength of the metal by controlling the nanoscale lattice structure of the metal.

# develop

to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) **develop** a strategy, (2) **develop** a skill We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

spy

 a person who is employed or trained to observe or gather information in secret, often for military or political purposes; a person who secretly or illegally gathers information about a private individual or organization

synonym: agent, undercover operative

The government recruited a **spy** to gather information on a suspected terrorist cell

soil

n. the top layer of Earth in which plants grow synonym: earth, ground, mud

(1) **soils** retentive of moisture, (2) parched **soil Soil** moisture is another significant component controlling soil respiration.

# digest

v. to transform food into absorbable substances; break down

synonym: absorb, condense

digest information, (2) help digest food

#### antibiotic

 a substance or drug that kills or slows down the growth of bacteria

synonym: antimicrobial, chemotherapeutic, germicide

# disease

 a disorder or illness that affects the body or mind, often characterized by specific symptoms or abnormal functioning of organs or systems

#### coordinate

# **function**

n. the purpose or use of an object, system, or process; a particular activity or operation that is designed to serve a specific purpose; a mathematical concept that describes a relationship between two sets of values, called the input and output sets; (verb) to operate or work in a specific way, or to perform a particular task or purpose

synonym

: purpose, mapping, job

#### communicate

# molecule

#### scream

# primitive

infant

a baby or very young child

synonym: baby, newborn, tot

context

par

n. a state of being equal to someone or something

decode

# reproduce

# unplanned

# relation

 the way two persons or groups of people feel and act toward one another

subtitle

poison

# organelle

# detect

v. to find or recognize something, especially something difficult to see, hear, etc.

synonym: catch, observe, notice

# experiment

 the scientific test conducted to observe what happens and gain new knowledge

synonym: experimentation, investigation

# infection

 a condition in which pathogenic microorganisms or viruses have entered the body

synonym: contagion, disease, transmission

(1) a bacterial **infection**, (2) treat the **infection** with antibiotics

Hospitals must meet various standards to prevent nosocomial **infections**.

#### tradition

 a belief, custom, or way of doing something that has been passed down from generation to generation within a group or society

synonym: custom, practice, ritual

(1) a **tradition** of a culture, (2) against **tradition**It is a **tradition** in many families to have a big Thanksgiving dinner with all their relatives.

# diagnose

v. to determine or distinguish the nature of a problem or an illness through a careful analysis

synonym: identify, analyze, interpret

#### smear

# validate

specific

- a sac, cavity, or abnormal growth in the body that is typically filled with fluid or semisolid material; usually benign but can also be cancerous and require treatment

The patient was sent for an X-ray to determine the cause of the **cyst** in her abdomen.

the formation of excess fibrous connective tissue in an organ or tissue, often associated with inflammation, scarring, or injury; a pathological condition that can affect various organs and tissues of the body, leading to impaired function and potential organ failure

synonym: scarring, hardening, fibrotic disease

# medical

- adj. relating to the treatment of illness or injuries; relating to the practice of medicine
- synonym: health, disease, treatment
- (1) a **medical** opinion, (2) temporary **medical** treatment The **medical** team worked quickly to save the patient's life.

# cough

- v. to expel air from the lungs suddenly and noisily, often as a reaction to irritation, illness, or some other physical condition; (noun) a sudden, forceful expulsion of air from the lungs, often accompanied by a distinctive sound
- synonym: hack, clear throat, wheeze

# **sputum**

# **laboratory**

*n.* a workplace for doing scientific research or teaching science; a lab

synonym: lab, workshop, testing room

# discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

(1) a scientific **discovery**, (2) the great **discovery** of the century

Her research team made an important discovery.

#### device

 a piece of equipment, tool, or technology that serves a particular purpose or function, often mechanical or electronic

synonym: gadget, instrument, tool

# damage

 to harm or cause injury to something or someone, often resulting in decreased value or functionality; to impair or negatively affect something, such as a reputation or relationship; (noun) harm or injury that is caused to a person, thing, or entity

#### tissue

# aggressive

adj. behaving in an angry, energetic, or threatening way towards another person; tending to spread quickly

# disappear

v. to cease to exist or be visible

#### severe

 adj. extremely serious or bad in feeling, manner, or strict and harsh; extremely strong or vigorous

synonym: harsh, relentless, powerful

#### eradicate

v. to get rid of or destroy something completely, especially something bad

synonym: destroy, eliminate, exterminate

# deem

- v. to consider or decide something in a particular way synonym: believe, consider, suppose

# negative

adj. having the quality of something bad or harmful; expressing refusal

synonym: minus, adverse, pessimistic

(1) have a **negative** effect, (2) a **negative** number The movie has received almost universally **negative** criticism.

# consequence

 the outcome of a particular action or event, especially relative to an individual

synonym: result, impact, outcome

(1) unintended **consequences**, (2) the **consequence** of an argument

These economic activities had disastrous environmental consequences.

# unfortunately

adv. by bad luck; unluckily

synonym: regrettably, unluckily, alas

(1) **unfortunately** caught in a shower, (2) even more **unfortunately** 

The treatments were done but, **unfortunately**, were unsuccessful.

#### scenario

a description of possible actions or events in the future;
 a written outline of a play, film, or literary work

synonym: plan, scheme, procedure
