foresee

v. to perceive or predict; to anticipate or expect something to happen in the future

synonym: predict, anticipate, forecast

improbable

adj. not likely to happen or be true; unlikely; having a low probability or chance of occurring

synonym: unlikely, doubtful, implausible

rhinoceros

 n. (also rhino) a large, thick-skinned mammal with one or two horns on the nose, typically found in Africa and Asia.

synonym: rhino, horned beast, pachyderm

The baby **rhinoceros** at the wildlife sanctuary was recently born and is very cute.

downplay

v. to present or represent as less important or severe; to minimize the significance of something

synonym: minimize, downsize, play down

The company tried to **downplay** the significance of the issue.

tame

v. to make wild animals domesticated or controlled, especially through specific training; (adjective) not dangerous or afraid of people, either naturally or

because of specific training

synonym: domesticate, soften, (adjective) harmless

(1) tame a wild beast, (2) a tame animal

We have to **tame** substantial financial deficits at first.

shoddy

adj. of poor quality or artistry; badly made or constructed; inferior or substandard

synonym: inferior, poor quality, substandard

(1) **shoddy** construction, (2) **shoddy** products

The **shoddy** craftsmanship of the new building caused it to start falling apart in just a few months.

- n. a parent of one's father or mother

eulogy

a speech or writing in praise of someone who has died,
 typically given at a funeral or memorial service

synonym: tribute, praise, commendation

chisel

 a tool with a sharpened edge at one end used for shaping wood, stone, or metal; (verb) to engage in deceitful behavior

hoard

paradoxical
