#### herdsman

sear

 a person who manages or cares for a herd of livestock, typically cattle, sheep, or goats

*synonym*: shepherd, grazier, rancher

remembered over a long time

- (1) nomadic **herdsman**, (2) livestock **herdsman**In rural areas, the role of a sheep **herdsman** is vital for managing and caring for the flock.

# improvisation

(1) **improvisation** on stage, (2) jazz **improvisation** He created a beautiful piece of music using only **improvisation**.

#### starch

 a complex carbohydrate found in many plants, including rice, wheat, and potatoes that is an important foodstuff for humans and animals

synonym: carbohydrate, glucose, dextrin

(1) starch granules, (2) potato starch

When heated, **starch** molecules absorb water and become thick and gooey, making it a useful thickening agent in

### cooking.

#### cassava

 a starchy, tuberous root plant that is native to South America and is grown in many tropical and subtropical regions around the world

synonym: manioc, yuca

(1) cassava flour, (2) cassava starch

**Cassava** leaves are also eaten as a vegetable in some parts of the world.

#### wondrous

adj. inspiring amazement or admiration; extremely beautiful and impressive

synonym: amazing, fantastic, miraculous

### meager

adj. small in quantity, quality, or size; insufficient or inadequate

synonym: scanty, sparse, insufficient

The refugee family had to survive on a **meager** amount of food and water daily.

#### tattered

 adj. worn, torn, or ragged in appearance or condition, usually as a result of long use or hard wear; frayed or falling apart

synonym: ripped, shabby, worn-out

The **tattered** book was falling apart at the seams from being read too many times.

#### destitute

adj. lacking basic material necessities such as food, shelter, and clothing; impoverished

synonym: poor, impoverished, needy

(1) **destitute** refugees, (2) living in **destitute** conditions The hurricane left many families **destitute** and without homes.

#### wreak

 to cause or bring about something, often as a result of harmful or destructive actions or events

synonym: cause, inflict, bring about

(1) **wreak** a lot of changes, (2) **wreak** further damage The virus has **wreaked** havoc on the healthcare system, overwhelming hospitals and causing shortages of supplies.

### vengeance

 the act of punishing or harming someone in return for something harmful that they have done

synonym: retaliation, retribution, revenge

(1) **vengeance** justice, (2) wreak **vengeance**He sought **vengeance** for the wrongs done to him.

# insurgent

adj. rising against established authority or government;characterized by rebellion, dissent, or insurgency

synonym: subversive, rebellious, mutinous

(1) insurgent attack, (2) insurgent group

The government forces fought brutally against the **insurgent** rebels in the remote region.

# kidnapping

n. the act of taking somebody away illegally and holding them captive

synonym: abduction, snatch, kidnap
