alto

n. the second-highest vocal range in choral music, typically sung by the second-highest singers in a choir; a type of saxophone

synonym: contralto, countertenor, soprano

(1) alto saxophone, (2) an alto solo

The alto singer had a unique and powerful voice.

freeway

 a major highway designed for high-speed traffic, with no stoplights or grade crossings and having interchanges or access roads to other highways

synonym: highway, expressway, motorway

(1) freeway exit, (2) expanded freeway

disparity

 a significant difference or inequality between two or more things

synonym: difference, inequality, gap

(1) the **disparity** between theory and reality, (2) income **disparity** 

There is a significant **disparity** in pay between men and women in the company.

rot

v. to decay, or cause something to decay, naturally and gradually

synonym: perish, decay, corrode

(1) begin to rot, (2) rot with age

Please refrigerate the meat, or it will **rot**.

#### counterclockwise

adv. in a direction opposite to the rotation of a clock's hands or opposite to the usual direction of movement or flow synonym: anticlockwise, reversely

(1) move **counterclockwise**, (2) swirl **counterclockwise**The carousel rotates **counterclockwise** at a slow pace.

#### hemisphere

- n. half of the terrestrial globe; half of a sphere
- (1) northern **hemisphere**, (2) cerebral **hemisphere**This weather pattern is unique to the southern **hemisphere**.

#### campfire

 an outdoor fire used for cooking, warmth, or light, often made by camping or in rural areas; a gathering or social event around such a fire

synonym: bonfire, blaze, fire pit

(1) **campfire** story, (2) roast marshmallows around the **campfire** 

We sat around the **campfire** and told stories late into the night.

#### nerd

 a person who is very interested in and knowledgeable about a particular subject such as computers, mathematics, chess, etc.

synonym: geek, techie, wonk

(1) a computer **nerd**, (2) **nerd** neck He was, by nature, a cyber **nerd**.

#### smokestack

 a vertical pipe or chimney, usually of brick or metal, through which smoke or exhaust gases from a fire or engine are discharged into the air

synonym: chimney, stack, flue

(1) smokestack emissions, (2) industrial smokestack

The **smokestack** on top of the factory released thick clouds of pollution into the air.

#### disperse

v. to spread out or distribute over a broad region, or to cause something to do so

synonym: dissipate, spread, scatter

(1) **disperse** false information, (2) **disperse** the protesters Before authorities **dispersed** the protesters, they yelled slogans.

## anthropology

- n. the scientific study of humanity, concerned with human behavior, human biology, cultures, societies, and linguistics in both the present and past, including past human species
- (1) social **anthropology**, (2) **anthropology** of religion The areas of **anthropology** and psychology are significantly related to one another.

#### cardinal

 a high-ranking official in the Roman Catholic Church, appointed by the Pope; a deep or bright red color; a bird of the finch family with a distinctive crest on its head; (adjective) of or relating to the highest or most important things

*synonym*: bishop, archbishop, carmine

(1) cardinal rule, (2) cardinal red

The **cardinal's** robes were made of rich red silk.

# segregation

n. the act or process of separating or isolating people, things, or groups based on race, gender, religion, social class, or other characteristics; a political or social system that enforces such separation or isolation

synonym: isolation, separation, discrimination

(1) racial segregation, (2) segregation of powerSegregation based on race or ethnicity is illegal and unjust.

#### redline

 a boundary or threshold beyond which something is no longer acceptable or allowed; a mark or line drawn in red to indicate a specific limit or danger zone *synonym*: boundary line, deadline, limit

(1) redline speed, (2) redline level

The neighborhood was affected by a **redline** drawn by real estate agents to keep specific populations out.

#### prophecy

- n. a statement or prediction that something will happen in the future, typically one made by a religious leadersynonym: prediction, foretelling, divination
- (1) **prophecy** fulfillment, (2) **prophecy** of doom

  The fortune teller's **prophecy** that I would meet my soulmate next year has yet to come true.

### unprepared

- adj. not properly or adequately prepared; lacking preparation; not ready
- synonym: inexperienced, caught off-guard, ill-equipped
- (1) **unprepared** speech, (2) **unprepared** for the exam The **unprepared** student struggled on the test and received a low grade.

#### sinister

- adj. giving the impression that something bad or evil is happening or will happen
- synonym: ominous, foreboding, evil
- (1) sinister look, (2) in sinister terms

The dark clouds in the sky gave off a sinister feeling.

#### artifact

- a person-made object, especially one of historical or cultural interest
- synonym: antique, relic, heirloom
- (1) paleolithic artifacts, (2) Peruvian artifacts

The museum has a vast collection of Greek artifacts.

#### hoe

- a garden tool with a flat blade attached at right angles to a long handle
- (1) garden hoe, (2) weeding hoe

She purchased a **hoe** and a sickle for a backyard vegetable

#### garden.

#### gentrify

v. to renovate, revitalize, or develop a deteriorated, predominantly urban area, often leading to the displacement of low-income or minority residents and the influx of more affluent residents and businesses

synonym: revitalize, renovate, renew

(1) gentrify a community, (2) gentrify a street

The new coffee shops and high-end boutiques are starting to **gentrify** the neighborhood.

#### epicenter

 the point on the earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake

synonym: ground zero, focus, center

(1) the **epicenter** of the sports world, (2) **epicenter** magnitude

The **epicenter** of the earthquake was located deep beneath the earth's surface.

## opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

# philanthropy

n. the practice of voluntarily helping the poor, especially by giving money

synonym: altruism, benevolence, generosity

(1) **philanthropy** organization, (2) private **philanthropy** Tech billionaires often spend the majority of their time on **philanthropy**.

# punchline

 n. the final sentence or phrase in a joke, which is intended to be funny or surprising and to bring the joke to a climax

synonym: joke, climax, comedic ending

(1) have no punchline, (2) the final punchline
