The threat of losing his job was the **spur** he needed to work harder.

menagerie

 a collection of wild animals, especially exotic ones, kept for display

synonym: collection, assortment, group

(1) a large menagerie, (2) menagerie keeper

The circus had a **menagerie** of animals, including elephants, lions, and monkeys.

incubate

v. to keep warm and protected, especially to hatch eggs; to develop and nurture

synonym: hatch, breed, gestate

The scientists decided to **incubate** the eggs for further study.

revered

synonym: respected, admired, honored

synonym: cock, chicken, hen

conquest

synonym: subjugation, domination, mastery

colonize

 to establish a colony in or on a specific place; to settle or occupy in large numbers

synonym: settle, occupy, inhabit

European powers **colonized** much of the Americas in the 16th and 17th centuries.

opioid

- n. substances that have an effect similar to opium, such as morphine, used in medicines to treat severe pain, but some people take them illegally for pleasure and become addicted

trait
