serving as a secondary or supporting element to something else

synonym: inferior, secondary, subservient

The CEO's **subordinate** employees were expected to follow his instructions without question.

totem

 a sacred object or symbol that represents a person, family, clan, or community, often used in indigenous cultures as part of a belief system or religious practice

synonym: emblem, symbol, mascot

(1) tribal totem, (2) animal totem

The **totem** pole symbolized the tribe's culture and history, depicting important figures and events.

favoritism

 the act of giving one person or group unfair support by someone in authority

synonym: bias, partiality, discrimination

national favoritism, (2) act of favoritism
 Their company survives due to political favoritism.

resentment

- n. bitterness or indignation at being treated unfairlysynonym: bitterness, enmity, animosity
- (1) abiding **resentment**, (2) bitter **resentment**She felt **resentment** towards her boss for not giving her a promotion.

credential

v. to provide someone with certification or verification of their qualifications, usually in a particular field or profession; (noun) a document attesting to the truth of certain stated facts

synonym: certify, verify, (noun) certificate

peck

v. to strike or bite someone or something repeatedly, usually with the beak or bill; to give a quick, small kiss or nibble

synonym: beak, nibble, pick

(1) **peck** on the cheek, (2) **peck** at feed

The wood **pecker** would peck at the tree high up in the branches.

secrecy

 the state or quality of being kept hidden or private; the act of keeping something confidential or unknown to others

synonym: confidentiality, clandestineness, closeness

(1) government **secrecy**, (2) maintain **secrecy**

The company's **secrecy** surrounding its new product launch has created consumer excitement and anticipation.

corrosive

 adj. having the ability to corrode or erode a material or substance; causing damage or deterioration over time; harmful or destructive

synonym: destructive, erosive, caustic

(1) **corrosive** substance, (2) **corrosive** effect

The **corrosive** acid ate away at the metal pipes.

brainstorming

- a group activity or business method in which a group of people meet and think about something at the same time to solve a problem or to create good ideas
- (1) **brainstorming** session, (2) do a **brainstorming** about a new product

Many companies employ **brainstorming** as a good way of generating innovative ideas.

interdependence
