oncology

 the branch of medicine that deals with the study and treatment of tumors, especially malignancies

synonym: cancer treatment, study of tumors

(1) oncology center, (2) modern oncology treatment

The pharmaceutical company unveiled its latest breakthrough drug for the **oncology** market.

cafeteria

 a restaurant where customers serve themselves from a counter and pay for what they have taken, often found in factories, colleges, hospitals, etc.

synonym: canteen, mess hall, restaurant

(1) cafeteria lunch, (2) office cafeteria

The university's **cafeteria** was busy with students and staff grabbing a quick lunch.

superannuate

v. to retire someone or something from active use on account of age or infirmity; to render something obsolete or no longer needed due to new developments or increasing irrelevance

synonym: retire, pension off, decommission

(1) **superannuate** employee, (2) **superannuate** at the age of 65

After working for the company for 30 years, he finally decided to **superannuate** and enjoy his retirement.

doe

 a mature female of mammals of which the male is called a buck, such as a deer or a rabbit

synonym: rabbit, bunny, hare

(1) doe rabbit, (2) buck and doe

Hunters use a whistle that makes the **doe** sound to lure stags.

cram

v. to force or try to fit a large amount of information into a short time, especially in preparation for an examination; to force or try to fit a large amount of something into a small space

synonym: stuff, pack, jam

(1) **cram** more circuits into chips, (2) **cram** five people into a car

She had to **cram** for the final exam and stayed up all night studying.

industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effort synonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

(1) industrious worker, (2) industrious student

He was known to be very **industrious** and would often work late into the night.

complicit

 adj. involved in or responsible for a wrongful or unethical act, often through inaction or silence; in cooperation with another person or group

synonym: compliant, involved, accessory

(1) complicit behavior, (2) complicit in cover-up

The accomplice was **complicit** in the crime committed by her partner.

tangle

n. a confused mass of something twisted togethersynonym: knot, snarl, entanglement

(1) in a tangle, (2) tangle wires

The cords behind my computer were a **tangled** mess.

catastrophic

adj. extremely harmful; causing physical or financial destruction

synonym: fatal, disastrous, destructive

(1) victim of **catastrophic** injuries, (2) **catastrophic** climate change

The extinction rate of aquatic animals was **catastrophic**.

futile

adj. incapable of producing any useful result; pointless *synonym*: useless, worthless, ineffective

(1) futile talk, (2) make a futile protest

It was **futile** to try and fix the broken vase, as it was too badly damaged.

defensible

adj. able to be defended or justified; justifiable or reasonable; capable of withstanding attack or criticism

synonym: justifiable, supportable, vindicable

(1) defensible fort, (2) defensible decision

The lawyer argued that his client's actions were **defensible** given the circumstances.

well-being

- n. the state of being happy and healthy and prosperoussynonym: health, welfare, happiness
- (1) the **well-being** of a nation, (2) a sense of **well-being** We are responsible for the care and **well-being** of all our employees.

shakeup

- a significant and often dramatic change or reorganization, especially in an organization or system
 synonym: reorganization, upheaval, disruption
- (1) **shakeup** plan, (2) political **shakeup**The new CEO announced a major **shakeup** in the company's management structure.

disrupt

v. to prevent or stop something, especially an event, activity, or process, from continuing in the usual way by causing a problem or disturbance

synonym: interrupt, disturb, break into

(1) **disrupt** a well-ordered condition, (2) **disrupt** sleep I'm so sorry to **disrupt** you when you're pretty busy.

uphold

v. to support or defend something, such as a law, idea, decision, etc.

synonym: defend, maintain, sustain

uphold the law, (2) uphold tradition
The judge may uphold the decision of the lower court.

impotent

adj. lacking power or ability to change things or to influence a situation

synonym: helpless, worthless, powerless

an impotent feeling, (2) sexually impotent
Modern medicine was largely impotent against the disease.

salesperson

 a person whose job is to sell goods in a shop or directly to customers synonym: dealer, seller, vendor

(1) a **salesperson** in a store, (2) a drapery **salesperson** He received the title of the best **salesperson** in all our branches worldwide.

externalize

v. to give external form, expression, or material existence to something that was previously internal or subjective; to make explicit or apparent something that was previously unconscious or repressed

synonym: express, manifest, materialize

- (1) **externalize** responsibilities, (2) **externalize** costs It's important to **externalize** your feelings and not keep them bottled up.
- to put someone in prison, especially for political or military reasons; (noun) a student or trainee who works, sometimes for free, to get work experience or to fulfill qualification criteria

synonym: apprentice, trainee, student

privatize

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

rampant

 adj. (especially of something bad or unwelcome) flourishing or spreading everywhere in a way that cannot be controlled

synonym: prevalent, dense, uncontrolled

intensify
