synonym: chains, fetters, handcuffs

lynch

v. to put to death or punish (usually by hanging) without legal authorization or due process, often as an act of mob justice or vigilante action; (noun) a violent punishment, often extrajudicial, in which a mob or group of people seize and kill someone, usually by hanging, as a form of punishment or vengeance

synonym: hang, execute, mob

The mob wanted to **lynch** the suspect before he could be tried in court.

depict

- v. to illustrate someone or something in a photograph synonym: illustrate, describe, express
- (1) **depict** a scene, (2) **depict** a feeling of isolation His son had accurately **depicted** the bloom.

portray

v. to depict or describe someone or something in a painting, film, book, or other artistic work

synonym: depict, describe, illustrate

(1) **portray** feelings in words, (2) accurately **portray** the condition

We often **portray** political problems as religious issues.

artifact

 a person-made object, especially one of historical or cultural interest

synonym: antique, relic, heirloom

(1) paleolithic artifacts, (2) Peruvian artifacts

The museum has a vast collection of Greek artifacts.

kente

 a colorful and intricately patterned fabric originating in Ghana; traditionally worn in a variety of ceremonial and formal contexts

synonym: colorful fabric, cloth, textile

(1) **kente** weaving, (2) traditional **kente**

The **kente** cloth worn by African royalty is made of vibrant, colorful strips of fabric.

camouflage

n. an outward appearance that conceals the underlying essence of something; the way of concealing troops or military equipment so they cannot be seen against the surrounding environment

synonym: guise, mask, cloak

(1) **camouflage** clothing, (2) work as **camouflage**. They utilized branches of trees as **camouflage**.

spandex

 a stretchy synthetic fiber that can be woven into fabric and used in tight-fitting garments such as exercise clothing or underwear

synonym: lycra, elastane, stretch fabric

(1) **spandex** leggings, (2) **spandex** gym clothes
The yoga pants were made of **spandex**, allowing for easy
movement during exercise.

burlap

 a rough, woven fabric made from jute, hemp, or other fibers, often used for making sacks

synonym: hessian, gunny, jute

(1) **burlap** table runner, (2) **burlap** ribbon

The farmer used **burlap** sacks to transport his vegetables to the market.

segregate

 ν . to separate or set apart from others, often based on race, gender, or some other characteristic

synonym: isolate, separate, divide

(1) **segregate** by race, (2) **segregate** boys and girls The school board decided to **segregate** students by the ability to meet their needs better.

disproportionate

adj. too large or too small when compared with something else, or not deserving its importance or influence

synonym: undeserved, unequal, superfluous

(1) cause **disproportionate** damage, (2) **disproportionate** amount

This big gate is disproportionate to the small hut.

incarcerate

v. to put or keep somebody in prison or in a place from which they cannot escape

synonym: confine, detain, imprison

(1) **incarcerate** the murderer, (2) **incarcerate** her for life He was **incarcerated** for the duration of the war.

confederate

 a person who is allied or associated with another person or group, especially in a political or military context; a supporter of the Confederate States of America

synonym: ally, associate, partner

(1) **confederate** soldier, (2) **Confederate** government The two countries are **confederates** and have a strong alliance.

millionaire

 a person who has material wealth that is valued at more than a million dollars, pounds, euros, etc. (1) **millionaire** capitalist, (2) become a **millionaire**The Internet **millionaire** was captivated by the artist's paintings.

chattel

 n. personal property, especially that which is movable and not fixed to land

synonym: property, possession, asset

(1) **chattel** mortgage, (2) personal property **chattels**The enslaved people were treated as **chattel** and had no rights or freedoms.

boggle

 to be overwhelmed or surprised by something; to hesitate or be uncertain about something; to cause someone to feel overwhelmed or surprised

synonym: hesitate, stagger, bewilder

(1) **boggle** the imagination, (2) **boggle** at the price The complexity of the situation can **boggle** the mind.

indigo

adj. a deep blue or purple-blue color; also, the plant that yields Indigo dye

synonym: blue, purplish-blue, violet-blue

(1) indigo fabric, (2) indigo plant

The **indigo** dye made the fabric a beautiful shade of blue.

epiphany

a moment of sudden and great realization or revelation;
 a Christian festival, held on 6 January, celebrating the visit of the three wise men to the infant Jesus

synonym: revelation, enlightenment, insight

synonym: isolation, separation, discrimination

(1) racial segregation, (2) segregation of powerSegregation based on race or ethnicity is illegal and unjust.

dismantle

v. to take apart or demolish (a structure, machine, system, or the like); to strip off fittings or equipment

synonym: take apart, demolish, take down

(1) **dismantle** a machine, (2) **dismantle** a system The old building had to be **dismantled** because it was structurally unsound.
