sluggish

adj. lacking energy, vitality, or motivation; slow or inactive in response, movement, or progress

synonym: lethargic, slow, inactive

(1) **sluggish** economy, (2) **sluggish** response After a long day at work, I feel **sluggish** and lack energy.

molasses

 a thick, dark syrup made from boiled sugar cane or sugar beet juice, often used as a sweetener in cooking and baking

synonym: treacle, syrup, honey

(1) molasses cookies, (2) thick molasses

The recipe calls for a tablespoon of **molasses** to add sweetness.

Kelvin

n. a unit of measurement for temperature in the International System of Units (SI), which starts at absolute zero, the theoretical lowest limit of temperature, and named after the British physicist William Thomson, also known as Lord Kelvin

synonym: K, degree

fluctuation

- synonym: change, instability, flux
- (1) price **fluctuations**, (2) **fluctuation** of water level Temperature **fluctuations** are often milder in oceanfront areas.

secondly

- adv. used to introduce the second point or item in a list or series of statements, considerations, etc.
- synonym: in the second place, next, subsequently
- (1) **secondly** connected, (2) **secondly**, it is important Firstly, we will discuss the budget; **secondly**, we will go over the schedule.

gravitational

- adj. relating to or caused by gravity (= the force that attracts objects towards one another)
- *synonym*: weighty, heavy, earthbound

drown

- synonym: douse, drench, overwhelm
