twofold

adj. consisting of two parts or aspects; doubled in size, quantity, or degree

synonym: doubled, dual, twinned

(1) twofold approach, (2) twofold difference

The **twofold** increase in sales was unexpected but welcomed by the company.

bounty

 a reward offered for capturing or killing someone or for accomplishing a specific task

synonym: reward, premium, recompense

(1) cash **bounty**, (2) a **bounty** on exports

The **bounty** hunter was hired to capture the notorious criminal and bring him to justice.

distract

 to draw someone's attention away from what they are trying to do

synonym: divert, preoccupy, confuse

(1) **distract** attention from the real issue, (2) **distract** public opinion

- v. to state or give order with total authority; to say or read aloud for somebody else to write down or to be recorded synonym: read out, prescribe, order
