orthopedic

surgeon

 a doctor who is trained to perform medical operations that involve cutting open a person's body

synonym: sawbones, doctor

an excellent brain surgeon, (2) army surgeon
 a skilled surgeon that has many years of training and experience.

appointment

 a formal arrangement to meet someone at a particular time and place, especially for a reason connected with their work; the act of putting a person into a job or position of responsibility

synonym: assignment, selection, commission

(1) **appointment** calendar, (2) take up an **appointment** We had to reschedule the dentist's **appointment**.

calculate

v. to judge or find out the amount or number of something by using mathematics

synonym: compute, figure, estimate

gram

- a metric unit of weight equal to one-thousandth of a kilogram

oxycodone

- a powerful opioid pain medication often prescribed for moderate to severe pain relief, often with a high risk of addiction and abuse
- (1) **oxycodone** addiction, (2) **oxycodone** withdrawal Some patients are prescribed **oxycodone** for pain management after surgery.

nonchalant

 adj. relaxed and calm in a way that shows a lack of concern or interest; seemingly indifferent

synonym: casual, relaxed, indifferent

opioid

med

escalate

prescription

a written or spoken instruction that directs a medical practitioner to prescribe a specific treatment or medication for a patient

conversation

an informal talk between two or more people to exchange their views, ideas, information, etc.

aggressive

nauseate

restless

adj. unwilling or unable to stay still or relax because you are worried and uneasy

miserable

adj. very unhappy, uncomfortable, or unpleasant; causing great distress or suffering

dial

to adjust or set the controls of a machine or device by turning a controller called dial; (noun) a disc on a telephone that is rotated a fixed distance for each number called

intense

adj. (especially of a feeling) very strong; extremely sharp or severe

synonym: extreme, fierce, harsh

internal

adj. of or relating to the inside of somethingsynonym: interior, inner, domestic

(1) **internal** organs, (2) the **internal** economy

thermostat

 a device that automatically regulates temperature by controlling the heating or cooling system based on the temperature in a room or building

synonym: thermoregulator, climate control

haywire

fluid

n. a substance that can flow and is not solid

nausea

stick

despair

 the feeling that there is no hope and you cannot do anything to improve a difficult situation

adj. having no hope; despairing; having no chance of success

patient

oversee

depth

the distance between the top and bottom of something;
 between the top surface and a distance below it

synonym: deepness, profoundness, extent

(1) depth camera, (2) the depth of the water

The pond's **depth** was around five feet.

initial

adj. of or happening at the beginning; (noun) the first letter of a word, especially a person's name

synonym: basic, primary, beginning

(1) initial velocity, (2) an initial letter

They took the **initial** step toward reconciliation.

recommendation

 an official suggestion that something is good or suitable for a particular purpose or job

synonym: guidance, advice, suggestion

competent

adj. having the necessary ability, knowledge, or skill to do something successfully

synonym: skilled, able, capable

wean

 to gradually stop feeding a baby or young animal with its mother's milk and to start or accustom to eating other food

agony

extreme physical or mental pain or suffering, often prolonged or intense

buckle

to bend out of shape, as under pressure or from heat;

brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

assume

 to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

outright

adj. completely; completely and without reservation; without any attempt at concealment

synonym: absolute, complete, unconditional

dramatic

adj. very sudden, very excellent, or full of action and excitement

core

insomnia

the condition of being unable to sleep, usually a chronic one

unbearable

 a building or hospital department where people can go for medical care or advice, especially of a particular condition

synonym: hospital, infirmary

breath

the air that is taken into and expelled from your lungs;
 the process of taking into and expelling air from your lungs

rehabilitate

v. to restore to good health or physical condition; to help someone return to a normal life, especially after a period of illness, addiction, or imprisonment

facility

 a building or place that provides a particular service or is used for a particular industry

methadone

 a synthetic opioid drug used to treat addiction to other opioid drugs, such as heroin, as well as to manage pain in some cases

discovery

 the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

gear

 a toothed wheel that engages another toothed mechanism to change the speed or direction of transmitted motion; a set of tools, equipment, or other items for a particular purpose

substance

 n. the real physical material of which a thing or person consist; the most important or main part of some idea or experience; an illegal drug

disorder

 an untidy state or a lack of organization; a physical condition or illness that causes problems with how a section of the body or brain functions

involve
