#### swan

a large waterbird with a long neck, bill, and webbed feet;
known for their elegant and graceful appearance

synonym: cygnet, waterfowl, bird

(1) swan song, (2) black swan

The **swan's** feathers glistened in the sunlight.

#### tease

 to make fun of someone or make jokes about them, either in a playful way or to upset them; to separate the fibers of something; to ruffle a person's or animal's hair by combing

synonym: bully, annoy, provoke

(1) tease the children, (2) tease wool

This ad is intended to **tease** a competing product.

#### pretension

n. the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

synonym: presumption, pretense, affectation

(1) **pretension** to authority, (2) baseless **pretension**His **pretensions** of being a gourmet were quickly exposed when he could not identify basic herbs and spices.

sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

#### unintended

adj. not planned or meant

synonym: accidental, unconsenting, involuntary

(1) **unintended** bias, (2) **unintended** misunderstanding Excessive human interference in the global environment may bring **unintended** consequences.

#### overlook

v. to fail to notice something; to watch over someone; to provide a view from above

synonym: disregard, look down, supervise

(1) overlook a street, (2) overlook that fact

We cannot **overlook** an opportunity for great success.

#### imprison

v. to confine a person to a prison, a detention facility, or a place of involuntary confinement

synonym: incarcerate, detain, confine

(1) **imprison** illegal immigrant, (2) **imprison** myself within the room

He was **imprisoned** for embezzlement.

#### dishonest

adj. capable of being corrupted, not honest synonym: fraudulent, deceitful, untrustworthy

#### solicitor

 a legal professional who provides advice and prepares legal documents, typically working in private practice on behalf of clients; a person who promotes business

synonym: suppliant, pleader, advocate

The property dispute was resolved amicably between the two parties with the help of a **solicitor**.

### upbringing

 the conditions and experiences in which a child is cared for and taught, especially in relation to their moral and social development

synonym: childhood, background, nurturing

His strict **upbringing** instilled in him a strong sense of responsibility.

#### burglar

n. a person who unlawfully enters a building or other property to steal or commit another crime

synonym: thief, robber, intruder

#### firsthand

adv. from the source; directly; (adjective) received directly from a source

#### humanize

 to make something or someone more humane or compassionate; to make something more relatable or understandable to humans

synonym: civilize, personalize

#### sniff

v. to inhale audibly through the nose, often to detect or identify a smell; to draw in air through the nostrils with a quick, audible intake of breath

synonym: smell, inhale, scent

The dog stopped to **sniff** around the tree, looking for something interesting.

### unwitting

adj. without purpose or intent

synonym: unknowledgeable, inadvertent, unintended

(1) unwitting victims, (2) an unwitting mistake

His rudeness was **unwitting**, not intentional.

#### implacable

adj. incapable of being appeased or pacified; relentless, unstoppable, or unyielding

synonym: inflexible, relentless, unyielding

(1) implacable criticism, (2) implacable hatred

Despite multiple negotiations, the opposing sides remained implacable and unwilling to compromise.

#### facade

the face or front of a building, especially a large one; superficial or false appearance intended to conceal something unpleasant

synonym: front, camouflage, masquerade

#### crumble

to break or fall apart into small pieces or fragments, especially due to age, decay, or lack of support

#### screwup
