#### absorb

- v. to take in a fluid or other substance gradually synonym: consume, soak, ingest
- absorb energy, (2) absorb a shock

## mystical

adj. relating to or characterized by spiritual powers; beyond ordinary understanding

synonym: occult, esoteric, enigmatic

## kingdom

n. the country ruled by a king or queen

## fantasy

#### beastie

## scruffy

 adj. unkempt or shabby in appearance; scrappy or disreputable in behavior or attitude

synonym: unkempt, messy, shabby

(1) scruffy hair, (2) scruffy clothes

The old building had a **scruffy** exterior with chipped paint and broken windows.

#### swan

a large waterbird with a long neck, bill, and webbed feet;
 known for their elegant and graceful appearance

synonym: cygnet, waterfowl, bird

(1) swan song, (2) black swan

The swan's feathers glistened in the sunlight.

## bang

v. to hit or cause to hit something in a way that makes a loud noise

*synonym*: crash, hit, smash

(1) **bang** his fist on a desk, (2) **bang** a phone down My father tried to **bang** mathematics into my head since childhood.

mum

 a British term for "mom" or "mother"; (adjective) failing to speak or communicate when expected to do so

synonym: mother, silent, soundless

(1) mum's cooking, (2) keep mum

My **mum** always knew how to comfort me when I was feeling down.

drag

v. to pull or haul with force

synonym: haul, pull, draw

(1) **drag** a chair over, (2) **drag** a team down

He **dragged** the heavy suitcase behind him as he walked.

upset

adj. causing or marked by anxiety, uneasiness, trouble, or grief; (verb) to make someone anxious, unhappy, or angry

synonym: disturbed, bothered, resentful

(1) get **upset**, (2) have an **upset** stomach

He was awfully **upset** by the news.

tease

v. to make fun of someone or make jokes about them, either in a playful way or to upset them; to separate the fibers of something; to ruffle a person's or animal's hair by combing

synonym: bully, annoy, provoke

This ad is intended to tease a competing product.

pretension

 the act of claiming or asserting something, especially without good reason or without evidence; an unfounded or excessive claim or ambition

synonym: presumption, pretense, affectation

(1) **pretension** to authority, (2) baseless **pretension**His **pretensions** of being a gourmet were quickly exposed when he could not identify basic herbs and spices.

messy

adj. disorganized and untidy

afford

- v. to have enough money or time to be able to buy or do something

## noisy

#### isolation

 the condition of being alone or lonely; the act or state of separation between persons or groups

#### divorce

n. the legal dissolution of a marriage

synonym: separation, dissolution, breakup

#### suffer

v. to experience pain, distress, or hardship; to undergo or endure something painful or unpleasant

## imprison

#### fraud

 the crime of gaining money or financial benefits by deceiving people; a person who makes deceitful pretenses

#### dishonest

adj. capable of being corrupted, not honest synonym: fraudulent, deceitful, untrustworthy

## burglar

- a person who unlawfully enters a building or other property to steal or commit another crime

#### apparent

adj. able to see or understand easily or clearly

## background

n. the details of a person's social heritage, such as family, vocational or educational experience; past information that is essential to understanding a situation or problem

#### decent

*adj.* satisfactory, acceptable, or good in a general sense *synonym*: respectable, honorable, good

#### associate

v. to mentally connect someone or something with someone or something else

synonym: tie in, link, consociate

#### humiliation

- n. the feeling of being made to feel ashamed or foolishsynonym: mortification, degradation, embarrassment

#### firsthand

adv. from the source; directly; (adjective) received directly from a source

#### humanize

v. to make something or someone more humane or compassionate; to make something more relatable or understandable to humans

#### survive

- v. to live or exist despite a dangerous event or period synonym: endure, persist, stay

## devastating

*adj.* causing a great deal of destruction or damage *synonym*: destructive, annihilative, disastrous

#### maintain

#### detect

## charity

#### instant

#### regret

v. to feel sad, repentant, or disappointed over something you have done or something you have not been able to do

#### ashamed

adj. feeling guilt, embarrassment, or remorse about something because of something you have done

synonym: regretful, repentant, mortified

## strength

 the quality or state of being physically, or sometimes mentally, strong

synonym: resilience, power, muscles

## reputation

 the general opinion that people have about someone or something, especially when this is based on their previous experiences or behaviors

synonym: fame, standing, esteem

## implacable

adj. incapable of being appeased or pacified; relentless, unstoppable, or unyielding

#### facade

the face or front of a building, especially a large one;

#### crumble

#### bedtime

n. the time at which a person typically goes to bed and prepares to sleep; the period just before bedtime, which may involve routines or activities that are intended to promote relaxation or sleepiness

synonym: sleep time, night-time

#### parcel

n. something wrapped in paper so that it can be carried or sent by post

#### relation

 the way two persons or groups of people feel and act toward one another

#### lifeline

 a line, rope, or cable used to support or rescue a person in danger or distress; vital or necessary support, connection, or source of help

synonym: savior, support, safety net

## inspire

- v. to make somebody fill with the desire, confidence, or enthusiasm, especially to do something creative

## achieve

## improve

## duckling

## encapsulate

#### quack

 a person who pretends to have medical or other skills or credentials that they do not possess; a charlatan or fraud; (verb) to make the sound of a duck

#### tiara
