This movie is likely to **evoke** strong emotions in the viewer.

uneasy

adj. causing or feeling anxiety or discomfort synonym: anxious, troubled, nervous

(1) have **uneasy** eyes, (2) **uneasy** relationship

He was **uneasy** about the situation and didn't know what to do.

downright

adj. (especially of something bad) complete and absolute;
 utter; (adverb) completely and absolutely

synonym: absolute, utter, complete

(1) **downright** nonsense, (2) **downright** impossible It was a **downright** lie that he would attend the event.

bliss

n. extreme happiness or joy

synonym: delight, euphoria, happiness

(1) ignorance is **bliss**, (2) ultimate **bliss**

The first two years of her marriage were sheer bliss.

bogus

adj. false or imitation; not genuinesynonym: fake, fraudulent, counterfeit

(1) **bogus** excuse, (2) **bogus** charities

He accused the company of using **bogus** advertising claims to sell its products.

snug

 adj. comfortably warm and cozy; fitting tightly and comfortably; compact and efficient in design

synonym: cozy, comfortable, kempt

The baby was fast asleep in his **snug** cot, swaddled in soft, warm blankets.

inexplicable

adj. unable to be explained, understood, or accounted for; mysterious or puzzling

synonym: incomprehensible, mysterious, unaccountable

The reason for his sudden disappearance from work was **inexplicable**.

rot

v. to decay, or cause something to decay, naturally and gradually

synonym: perish, decay, corrode

(1) begin to **rot**, (2) **rot** with age

Please refrigerate the meat, or it will **rot**.

etch

owl

v. to carve, cut, or engrave (a design or text) into a hard surface; to corrode, erode or eat away at a metal surface using acid or another chemical substance to create a design or pattern

synonym: engrave, inscribe, carve

creditor

cliche

 a phrase or expression that has become overused to the point that it has lost its original impact or meaning; a trite or unoriginal idea or statement

synonym: truism, platitude, stereotype

Using the same **cliche** phrase in every conversation can take time and effort.

morph

 synonym: alter, modify, transform

hazmat

 abbreviation of Hazardous Material, referring to substances that pose a risk to human health and the environment

synonym: hazardous material, toxic substances

(1) hazmat material, (2) hazmat incident

The hazardous materials team was called to the scene in their **hazmat** suits.

serene

adj. calm, peaceful, and untroubled; free from disturbances or worries

synonym: calm, peaceful, tranquil

(1) **serene** landscape, (2) a **serene** atmosphere

The **serene** sunset over the ocean was a peaceful sight to behold.

catastrophe

- n. a sudden event that causes extreme ruin and misfortunesynonym: disaster, calamity, cataclysm

The lack of funds has resulted in a **catastrophe** for our university system.

proverb

synonym: adage, saying, maxim

decode

 to convert something, such as a message or piece of information, from a specific form into one that you can understand

synonym: decipher, translate, interpret

 a faint or indistinct image or sound; something that is not clear or distinct; (verb) to become unclear; to lose clear vision

synonym: smudge, smear, fuzz

The camera's focus was off, and the image was a **blur** of colors and shapes.
