- adj. feeling isolated, estranged, or disconnected from others, often due to a sense of difference or lack of belonging synonym: isolated, estranged, disconnected

#### steer

- to control the direction or movement of a vehicle; to direct a course of action; to guide or motivate someone synonym: guide, direct, control
- (1) **steer** a steady course, (2) **steer** a conversation The captain told him to **steer** the ship north.

#### immerse

to become fully involved in a particular activity; to dip or submerge in a liquid, especially so that they or it are entirely covered

*synonym*: dip, inundate, submerge

(1) **immerse** the cloth in the dye, (2) completely **immerse** the ingredient

He **immersed** himself in his research.

#### monk

a member of a religious community of men living under vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience

synonym: friar, cleric, brother

(1) monk lifestyle, (2) cloistered monk The ascetic **monk** spent his days in prayer and contemplation in the monastery.

#### maze

a complex network of winding passages or pathways designed as a puzzle or challenge for people to navigate through

synonym: labyrinth, puzzle, network

(1) puzzle **maze**, (2) labyrinth **maze** 

We got lost in the **maze** of streets while exploring the city.

### opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

#### reciprocate

v. to give, feel, or show in response to something that has been given, felt, or shown; to respond to a kind or friendly gesture by doing something similar in return; to exchange or interchange in a reciprocal manner

synonym: return, exchange, give back

- (1) **reciprocate** a kindness, (2) **reciprocate** a gesture The two countries **reciprocated** each other's goodwill gestures by exchanging cultural visits.

synonym: stairway, stairwell
