 to estimate something to be greater in amount or importance than it really is

*synonym*: overrate, overvalue, embellish

(1) **overestimate** the value, (2) **overestimate** the amount of time spent

He tends to **overestimate** his abilities.

#### cryptocurrency

- any system of electronic money that does not rely on any central authority to uphold or maintain it
- (1) **cryptocurrency** boom, (2) **cryptocurrency** market The **cryptocurrency** community is becoming more diverse every year.

### downplay

- v. to present or represent as less important or severe; to minimize the significance of somethingsynonym: minimize, downsize, play down
- (1) **downplay** my ability, (2) **downplay** mistakes

  The company tried to **downplay** the significance of the issue.

### quantify

- v. to express or measure something in numerical terms synonym: measure, express, determine
- (1) **quantify** the results, (2) **quantify** blood flow He tried to **quantify** the amount of product that was needed to complete the job.

#### bluff

v. to try to deceive someone into believing that you can or are going to do something, or that you have knowledge or abilities; (noun) a high steep bank, usually formed by river erosion

synonym: abrupt, cliff, precipice

(1) bluff the other side, (2) riverside bluffHe bluffed a person out of going.

### probabilistic

adj. characterized by the influence of chance or probability; involving the use of statistical models or methods to estimate likelihoods or risks

synonym: probable, statistical, likely

(1) **probabilistic** model, (2) **probabilistic** approach In a **probabilistic** system, the outcome is uncertain and can

vary based on chance.

#### intuition

the ability to understand or know something without reasoning or evidence; a feeling that guides a person to do or believe something without fully understanding why

*synonym*: instinct, gut feeling, sixth sense

- (1) creative intuition, (2) intuition research Some studies suggest that people's **intuitions** can be influenced by their experiences and biases.
- n. a cultural idea, value, or pattern of behavior that is passed from one generation to another by imitation rather than genetic means; (as an Internet meme) an image, a video, a piece of text, etc. that is remixed, copied, and circulated in a shared cultural experience online

synonym: buzzword, trend

(1) pronounce **meme**, (2) religious **meme** This cute dog's photo spread around the world as an Internet meme.

#### outgrow

- to grow too large for something; to grow taller or faster than another person
- (1) **outgrow** my coat, (2) **outgrow** its usefulness Bamboo will soon **outgrow** the other plants.

to measure or adjust something, typically a machine or device, to ensure accurate functioning or to match a standard or desired level of performance

synonym: adjust, fine-tune

(1) calibrate machinery, (2) calibrate measurements It's important to **calibrate** the equipment regularly to ensure accurate results.
