enslave

v. to make someone a slave; to deprive someone of their freedom of choice or action

synonym: coerce, deprive, imprison

devalue

- v. to reduce the value or worth of somethingsynonym: diminish, depreciate, reduce
- (1) **devalue** the pound, (2) **devalue** a brand Her negative comments about the project only **devalued** the team's efforts.

excite

- v. to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
- (1) **excite** the crowd, (2) **excite** rebellion The news of her promotion **excited** her.

nurture

v. to take care of, feed, and protect someone or something while they are growing and developing

synonym: boost, cultivate, enable

Schools should **nurture** children's mutual interest spirit.

lily

- a flowering plant with large, showy, trumpet-shaped flowers, typically symbolizing purity, innocence, and beauty

opportune

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

indignity

 an affront to one's dignity or self-respect; an insult or humiliating treatment

synonym: humiliation, insult, offense

indignity of poverty, (2) suffer an indignity
 Being demoted at work was a great indignity to him.

proximate

adj. very near or close, either in space or time; immediately preceding or following something

synonym: immediate, closest, nearest

(1) proximate region, (2) proximate location

The **proximate** cause of the accident was the driver texting on their phone.

nap

n. a short sleep, especially during the day

synonym: rest, doze, drowse

(1) take a **nap**, (2) daytime **nap**

She woke the kids up from their **nap**.

dementia

 a severe decline in cognitive function, especially memory, as a result of disease or injury

synonym: cognitive decline, memory loss, Alzheimer's disease

(1) dementia patients, (2) probably have dementia

The study found that regular exercise can help to prevent the onset of **dementia** in older age.

undeniable

adj. not possible to deny; true or certain *synonym*: absolute, definite, indubitable

slippery

synonym: smooth, glistening, furtive

seep

trustworthy
