octane

a hydrocarbon compound (C8H18) that is a component of gasoline and is used as a measure of fuel quality, with higher octane ratings indicating better performance and greater resistance to engine knock

synonym: fuel, gas, gasoline

Premium gas has a higher octane rating, which makes it more expensive than regular gasoline.

neurology

admiral
