#### subsidize

*synonym*: finance, endow, sponsor

#### insecure

adj. not firm or firmly fixed; likely to fail or give way, or not assured of safety

synonym: uncertain, unsure, unconfident

Children in an unstructured environment often feel **insecure**.

#### evict

 to expel someone from a property, especially with the support of the law

synonym: oust, expel, eject

(1) **evict** a person from his home, (2) **evict** squatter The landlord may **evict** tenants for violations of the lease agreement.

## disproportionately

adv. in a way that is not reasonably or appropriately balanced, equal, or distributed; in a manner that is unequal or excessive about something else

*synonym*: excessively, unequally

(1) **disproportionately** affected, (2) **disproportionately** high

The rich can often **disproportionately** benefit from tax breaks and other advantages.

#### collide

to hit something violently when moving

synonym: clash, slam, contradict

(1) **collide** head-on, (2) **collide** in midair The interests of the two countries **collide**.

#### dismantle

ν. to take apart or demolish (a structure, machine, system, or the like); to strip off fittings or equipment

synonym: take apart, demolish, take down

(1) **dismantle** a machine, (2) **dismantle** a system The old building had to be **dismantled** because it was structurally unsound.

## alarming

adj. causing concern or apprehension; causing a feeling of danger, harm, or emergency; unsettling or disturbing

synonym: forbidding, concerning, disturbing

(1) alarming news, (2) alarming statistics

The sudden rise in crime rates in our neighborhood is quite **alarming**.

#### scramble

v. to move or climb quickly and awkwardly, often using your hands to help you

synonym: jumble, disarrange

(1) **scramble** my mind, (2) **scramble** for support Local business owners **scrambled** to find skilled workers.

#### misnomer

 a name or term that is inaccurate or misleading, often because it does not accurately describe the thing it is naming

synonym: misnaming, misapplication, inaccuracy

(1) a **misnomer** for the term, (2) technical **misnomer**The name "killer whale" is a **misnomer** as they rarely attack humans.

#### relocate

v. to move or move something or someone to a new place and build a house or a business there

synonym: emigrate, resettle, migrate

relocate a company, (2) relocate with a new job
 The university relocated to campuses several miles away.

#### homebound

adj. confined to one's home or place of residence due to illness, disability, or age; referring to someone who is returning or traveling towards their home

synonym: confined, restricted

(1) **homebound** patient, (2) **homebound** care The **homebound** student received extra tutoring to ensure they didn't fall behind in their studies.

## meticulously

adv. with great attention to detail; thoroughly and carefully synonym: carefully, attentively, scrupulously

(1) **meticulously** crafted product, (2) **meticulously** executed

She **meticulously** planned every detail of her wedding.

#### scrub

v. to clean something thoroughly, typically with a brush and soap or detergent

synonym: clean, wash, sanitize

(1) **scrub** off graffiti, (2) **scrub** dirt from potatoes

She decided to **scrub** the kitchen floor to remove all the dirt and grime.

#### influx

 the arrival or entry of a large number of people, objects, or ideas into a place or system

synonym: inflow, arrival, impression

(1) **influx** of capital, (2) **influx** of tourists

The **influx** of immigrants into urban areas can create significant social, economic, and political challenges for local communities.

#### caseload

the number of cases or clients that a particular professional or organization is responsible for managing or dealing with, particularly in the legal or medical field

synonym: workload, througput, casework

(1) heavy caseload, (2) caseload capacity

The lawyer was overwhelmed with her **caseload** of difficult cases.

#### slum

 a heavily populated urban area characterized by poor, run-down housing and infrastructure, often associated with poverty and social neglect

synonym: shantytown, slumdwellings, ghetto

(1) **slum** area, (2) **slum** dwellers

The government needs to invest more in affordable housing options to reduce the number of people living in **slums**.

# binge

 a period of excessive or uncontrolled consumption, often of food or alcohol; a spree or bout of reckless behavior or indulgence

synonym: spree, overindulgence, splurge
