schizophrenia

 a severe mental disorder in which a person has a distorted view of reality and may experience hallucinations, delusions, and disordered thinking and behavior

synonym: psychosis, disorder, mental illness

(1) **schizophrenia** spectrum disorder, (2) **schizophrenia** treatment

The **schizophrenia** patient was experiencing severe auditory hallucinations.

medicinal

adj. of or relating to the treatment or cure of disease synonym: curative, therapeutic, healing

(1) **medicinal** chemistry, (2) traditional **medicinal**The **medicinal** properties of this herb have been known to help with various ailments.

bipolar

- adj. of, relating to, or occurring in both polar regions; of or relating to manic depressive illness
- (1) **bipolar** depression, (2) a **bipolar** semiconductor The physician prescribed medication to treat **bipolar** disorder.

opportune

adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose

synonym: suitable, timely, practical

(1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

statin

 a type of drug used to lower cholesterol levels in the blood, typically by inhibiting an enzyme involved in

cholesterol production

synonym: cholesterol-lowering drug

(1) take a **statin** pill, (2) **statin** therapy

The side effects of **statins** can include muscle pain and weakness.

animate

- v. to make something full of interest and energysynonym: invigorate, energize, enliven
- (1) **animate** the body, (2) **animate** his soul The positive attitude of the supervisor **animated** the discussion.

grind

 to reduce something to small particles or powder by crushing or rubbing it; to work hard over a long period of time

synonym: mill, crush, grate

(1) **grind** away at my work, (2) **grind** your teeth She had to **grind** the coffee beans before making a fresh cup.

smoothie

n. a thick, blended beverage made from fruits, vegetables, and often other ingredients such as yogurt, milk, or protein powder; a person, typically a man, who is suave, charming, and polished

synonym: shake, smoothie, blended drink

(1) smoothie recipe, (2) fruit smoothie

She blended strawberries, yogurt, and ice to make a delicious **smoothie** for breakfast.

droplet

n. a small drop of liquid

synonym: bead, drip, dewdrop

(1) droplet size, (2) droplet formation

A single **droplet** of water can reflect the entire world upside down.

greet

to say hello to someone; to express welcome on meeting someone

synonym: welcome, salute, acknowledge

(1) greet a customer, (2) greet an idea

He **greeted** his friends with a warm smile and a hug.

inherit

to receive money, property, or a title from someone after they have died

synonym: obtain, gain, acquire

(1) inherit estate, (2) inherit ancestral property After his death, his sons **inherited** his business.

trait

a particular feature of your nature

synonym: attribute, feature, quality

(1) chemical trait, (2) personality traits

Multiple genes may influence behavioral traits concurrently.

synapse

- the fact or state of failing to finish an activity and of n. stopping using, making, or doing it
- (1) synapse circuit, (2) end at a synapse

Animals transmit nerve impulses through **synapses**.

overdrive

a gear in a vehicle that allows the engine to operate at a higher speed than the vehicle's speed, resulting in greater fuel efficiency and smoother driving; (verb) to drive or work too hard

synonym: high gear, high speed, turbocharge

- (1) atrial **overdrive** pacing, (2) go into **overdrive** The car's **overdrive** function allows it to shift into a higher gear for better fuel efficiency on the highway.
- to make someone feel suddenly enthusiastic or eager synonym: thrill, exhilarate, animate
