#### tremendous

### philosophy

#### altruism

n. the belief or practice of disinterested and selfless concern for the well-being of others; unselfish devotion to the welfare of others often expressed as acts of kindness or charity

### neglect

### subtly

adv. in a way that is so small or delicate as to be difficult to notice or describe

#### diminish

v. to reduce or be reduced in size, extent, or importance; to make something smaller, weaker, etc.

### converge

#### malaria

#### disease

#### eradicate

v. to get rid of or destroy something completely, especially something bad

### smallpox

 a highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever, weakness, spots on the skin, and often death

#### estimate

v. to guess or calculate the cost, size, value, etc. of something

### thereby

adv. as a result; consequence of a particular action or set of conditions

synonym: thus, hence, as a result

(1) **thereby-obtained** data, (2) **thereby** improving overall health

The new software will streamline the workflow, **thereby** increasing productivity.

#### achieve

v. to successfully complete a task or goal, often through hard work, perseverance, and dedication; to attain or

accomplish something that one has set out to do synonym: accomplish, attain, reach

(1) achieve success, (2) achieve milestones

I will work hard to achieve my goals and realize my dreams.

#### distribute

v. to give something to a large number of individuals, or to spread or furnish something

synonym: broadcast, disperse, hand out

### long-lasting

adj. existing or continuing for a long time

synonym: enduring, abiding, durable

n. a substance used to kill insects

synonym: pesticide, bug-killer, rodenticide

### opportune

#### creature

### planet

### penny

### philanthropic

adj. characterized by a desire to promote the welfare of others, especially by donating money or providing charitable aid; of or relating to the practice of philanthropy

synonym: charitable, benevolent, generous

 philanthropic organization donated millions of dollars to

fund medical research.

#### nuclear

adj. of or relating to or constituting the nucleus of an atom;
 deriving destructive energy from the release of atomic energy

synonym: atomic

(1) nuclear fusion, (2) use of nuclear power

Many countries have now agreed to a treaty banning the use of **nuclear** weapons.

### pandemic

 an outbreak of a disease that affects many people over a very wide area

### permanent

#### extinction

- n. the complete disappearance of a species from the earth synonym: disappearance, eradication, annihilation

### catastrophe

- n. a sudden event that causes extreme ruin and misfortunesynonym: disaster, calamity, cataclysm

The lack of funds has resulted in a **catastrophe** for our university system.

### involve

- v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

### tragedy

n. an event or situation causing great loss, misfortune, or destruction; a play or literature that deals with a severe and sad event and often ends with the death of the main character

### unimaginable

adj. beyond what can be imagined or conceived; impossible to comprehend or envision

The complexity of scientific theories was **unimaginable** for most people.

#### curtail

v. to reduce or restrict something; to shorten or truncate; to cut short or bring to an abrupt end

Due to budget constraints, the company had to **curtail** its marketing campaign for the new product.

### typical

adj. having the usual characteristics or traits of a specific group of things

synonym: characteristic, usual, distinctive

#### mammalian

adj. of or relating to mammals, a class of warm-blooded vertebrate animals that typically nurse their young and have hair or fur on their skin; characterized by mammalian qualities, such as nurturing and protective behavior

synonym: animal, mammal-like, warm-blooded

(1) **mammalian** embryo, (2) **mammalian** evolution **Mammalian** milk is known to be rich in protein and essential vitamins.

#### individual

- n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a group synonym: person, being, self
- (1) a private **individual**, (2) **individual** freedom
  As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

#### preserve

 to keep or maintain a particular quality, feature, etc., especially to prevent it from decaying, being damaged, or being destroyed

synonym: conserve, care for, maintain

(1) **preserve** my strength, (2) **preserve** a country's heritage They worked hard to **preserve** the nature of their native lands.

### proportion

 a part, share, or amount of something considered in comparative relation to a whole

synonym: ratio, balance, consonance

(1) direct **proportion**, (2) a building of vast **proportions**He is more concerned about the **proportion** of his body fat than usual because of an upcoming bodybuilding competition.

#### extreme

adj. very great in amount or degree synonym: farthermost, outermost, fierce

extreme sports, (2) extreme weather events
 Solar gravity creates extreme pressures and temperatures.

### poverty

- n. the condition of being extremely poorsynonym: deprivation, destitution, poorness
- (1) **poverty** alleviation, (2) the cycle of **poverty**Many studies have investigated the relationship between **poverty** and academic achievement.

#### decriminalize

v. to eliminate or reduce the criminal penalties associated with an act or behavior; to make legal or permissible something that was previously outlawed or punishable by law

synonym: legalize, decriminalization, depenalize

#### homosexual

#### intractable

adj. difficult to manage or control; stubborn or obstinatesynonym: obstinate, stubborn, unyielding

#### flourish

- v. to grow or develop vigorously or successfully synonym: boom, advance, succeed
- (1) **flourish** economically, (2) **flourish** worldwide
  The Ottoman Empire **flourished** for over five centuries.

### discovery

n. the act or process of finding information, a place, or an object, or learning about something that was previously not known

synonym: finding, uncovering, detection

(1) a scientific **discovery**, (2) the great **discovery** of the century

Her research team made an important discovery.

### govern

 to legally control and direct a country, city, group of people, etc. and be responsible for introducing new laws, organizing and maintaining public services

synonym: control, rule, preside

(1) a nation's right to **govern**, (2) **govern** a public enterprise The regulations **governing** medical malpractice claims are rigorous.

### entirely

adv. completely

synonym: completely, fully, totally

(1) **entirely** satisfied with the meal, (2) he was **entirely** to blame

Later, his claim was found to be entirely false.

### accomplishment

 the successful completion of a task or goal; an ability that has been acquired by training

synonym: success, achievement, complete

(1) proud of his **accomplishments**, (2) the **accomplishment** of a social goal

Graduating from college was a major **accomplishment** for her.

### technological

adj. based on scientific and industrial progress

synonym: specialized, technical

(1) **technological** advancement, (2) **technological** policy **Technological** advances have disrupted many industries.

### possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake

The **possibility** of getting the disease will drastically increase.

#### climate

n. the weather in a particular location averaged over some long period

synonym: atmosphere, weather, environment

(1) a cold **climate**, (2) effects of **climate** change **Climate** and weather have an impact on every part of our lifestyles.

#### horizon

 the line at which the earth's surface and the sky appear to meet; the range of interest or activity that can be anticipated

*synonym*: skyline, view, visible boundary

(1) the event **horizon** of a black hole, (2) business **horizon** As the sun set, the colors of the sky merged with the **horizon**, creating a beautiful orange and pink hue.

### synthetic

adj. made by combining chemical substances as opposed to being naturally occurring

synonym: artificial, manufactured, fabricated

**Synthetic** diamonds play an essential role as machine tool blades.

### biology

- the scientific study of life and the natural processes of living things
- (1) evolutionary **biology**, (2) cell and molecular **biology** In junior high school, we had to dissect a frog in **biology** class.

#### virus

 a tiny infectious organic material that causes disease in people, animals, and plants

synonym: bacterium, germ, ailment

(1) spread of the **virus**, (2) a strain of **virus** 

An infected person in the hospital will likely pass the **virus** to others.

### contagious

adj. able to be passed on to others through contact or proximity, especially by infection or disease

synonym: infectious, transmissible, communicable

(1) **contagious** enthusiasm, (2) **contagious** virus

The disease is highly **contagious** and spreads quickly.

#### lethal

adj. causing or capable of causing death; extremely dangerous

synonym: destructive, fatal, brutal

### geoengineering

n. the study of finding ways to change the Earth's climate system, primarily to reduce global warming; deliberate and large-scale intervention in the Earth's climate system (1) **geoengineering** technology, (2) **geoengineering** schemes

### dramatically

adv. in a very impressive manner

### intelligent

adj. having the capacity for thought and reason, especially to a high degree

synonym: brilliant, clever, competent

(1) an **intelligent** person, (2) **intelligent** assisting system **Intelligent** robots that can cooperate with humans have limited motor output for safety.

#### stake

 a share or financial investment in something such as a business; a wooden or metal post set up to mark something

*synonym*: share, interest, post

(1) execution by burning at a **stake**, (2) buy the company's **stake**

### probabilistic

adj. characterized by the influence of chance or probability;
 involving the use of statistical models or methods to
 estimate likelihoods or risks

synonym: probable, statistical, likely

(1) **probabilistic** model, (2) **probabilistic** approach In a **probabilistic** system, the outcome is uncertain and can vary based on chance.

#### nervous

adj. worried and anxious about something; relating to the nerves

a person who flies an aircraft, especially as a job; a


