#### hotbed

 a place or situation where something, such as a particular activity or problem, is developing or becoming more intense

synonym: breeding ground, center, focus

## staphylococcus

 n. (also staph) a type of bacteria that can cause various types of infections in humans, including skin infections, pneumonia, and food poisoning

synonym: bacteria, microbe, germ

#### aureus

a type of bacteria, particularly the species
 Staphylococcus aureus, that can cause a range of infections in humans and animals, often resistant to antibiotics and can be difficult to treat; (adjective, "golden" or "of gold" in Latin) relating to something that is gold-colored or has properties similar to gold

synonym: (adjective) golden

#### lookout

 a person or group of people who are responsible for watching for danger or other potential threats and warning others of their presence

synonym: watchman, sentinel, guard

#### latch

 a device for holding a door or gate closed, typically a sliding bar or bolt

synonym: lock, catch, bolt

## inject

 to put a liquid such as a drug or other substance into a person's or an animal's body using a needle and syringe (= small tube)

synonym: shoot, infiltrate, insinuate

Let's try to inject a bit of enthusiasm into your performance.

## reprogram

v. to modify or recreate a program

*synonym*: recreate, modify, revamp

## disrupt

#### tandem

yin

yang

 in Chinese philosophy, the masculine or active principle characterized as light and the sun and associated with hardness, dryness, and heat
