in-law

surgeon

 a doctor who is trained to perform medical operations that involve cutting open a person's body

injury

 harm done to a person's or an animal's body caused by an accident or an attack

bacteria

staphylococcus

 n. (also staph) a type of bacteria that can cause various types of infections in humans, including skin infections, pneumonia, and food poisoning

synonym: bacteria, microbe, germ

aureus

n. a type of bacteria, particularly the species
Staphylococcus aureus, that can cause a range of infections in humans and animals, often resistant to antibiotics and can be difficult to treat; (adjective, "golden" or "of gold" in Latin) relating to something that is gold-colored or has properties similar to gold

synonym: (adjective) golden

Staphylococcus **aureus** is a type of bacteria that can cause skin infections.

resistant

receptor

lookout

 a person or group of people who are responsible for watching for danger or other potential threats and warning others of their presence

latch

 a device for holding a door or gate closed, typically a sliding bar or bolt

clue

evolution

yin

n. in Chinese philosophy, the feminine or passive principle characterized as darkness and the moon and associated with softness, wetness, and cold

The concept of **yin** and yang is central to traditional Chinese philosophy.

yang

n. in Chinese philosophy, the masculine or active principle characterized as light and the sun and associated with hardness, dryness, and heat

synonym: masculine, positive, active

(1) the **yang** principle, (2) embody **yang** energy
He saw the balance between the yin and **yang** as crucial for a harmonious life.

prey

the object of a hunt; an animal hunted or trapped for eating

synonym: target, quarry, chase

microscopic

adj. tiny; exceedingly precise and detail-oriented; of or used in microscopy

abundant

adj. present in great quantity

 any of the nine large celestial bodies that circle in the solar system; any celestial body that revolves around a star synonym: earth, world, globe

conform

bacillus

 a rod-shaped bacterium typically found in soil or water, some of which are responsible for causing disease in humans and animals

dysentery

- a disease of the bowels characterized by severe and bloody diarrhea (= frequent and watery bowel movements)

severe

adj. extremely serious or bad in feeling, manner, or strict and harsh; extremely strong or vigorous

diarrhea

 a common digestive disorder with the frequent passage of loose, watery stools that can be caused by various factors such as infections, food poisoning, and certain medications

synonym: looseness, gastroenteritis, dysentery

(1) **diarrhea-related** dehydration, (2) **diarrhea** with abdominal pain

I had a terrible case of **diarrhea** and couldn't stop going to the bathroom.

invention

 the creation of a new device or process resulting from study and experimentation; the act of inventing

synonym: creation, design, innovation

patient

 a person who is receiving medical treatment, care, or attention from a healthcare professional, such as a doctor, nurse, or therapist; a personal quality or characteristic

synonym: client, recipient, subject

survive

- v. to live or exist despite a dangerous event or period synonym: endure, persist, stay

experiment

 the scientific test conducted to observe what happens and gain new knowledge

synonym: experimentation, investigation

filter

 any of several types of equipment or systems used to separate particles from liquids or gases or to remove specific forms of light

synonym: strainer

(1) gas filter, (2) clogged filter

Ozone is a primary **filter** to protect Earth's surface from harmful UV rays.

cult

 a small religious group, especially one that is not part of a larger religion and that is regarded as outside the norm; followers of an exclusive system of beliefs and practices

synonym: sect, faith, religion

The **cult** leader promised his followers that they would achieve enlightenment if they followed his teachings.

observe

biology

sufficient
