uncomfortable

adj. providing or feeling physical discomfort or slight pain synonym: comfortless, discomforting, painful

fraud

the crime of gaining money or financial benefits by deceiving people; a person who makes deceitful pretenses

encourage

to give someone support, confidence, or hope; to ν. persuade someone to do or continue to do something by making it easier for them and making them believe it is a good thing to do

whistleblower

demote

threat

perpetual

adj. continuing for an extended period in the same way without stopping or being interrupted

uphill

whistle

historic

- adj. famous or significant in history, or potentially so synonym: memorable, momentous, historical

traitor

tattletale

funnel

fake

viral

adj. relating to or caused by a virus

identity

n. the fact of being who or what somebody or something is; the features, emotions, or ideas that distinguish persons from one another

synonym: character, personality, individuality

exposed

adj. having no protection or shield from something, such as bad weather, attack, or criticism

synonym: endangered, revealed, disclosed

adj. relating to or characteristic of a college or university;

- to withdraw from one's position or occupation, especially because of age

clerk

a person who works in an office and is responsible for n. keeping records, writing letters, etc.; a person who works in a store and is responsible for serving customers

stumble

typical

adj. having the usual characteristics or traits of a specific group of things

synonym: characteristic, usual, distinctive

specific

adj. clearly defined or particular to a certain thing or situation; distinct, explicit, and precise

synonym: particular, definite, distinct

withdrawal

n. the act of taking money out of an account; the act of ceasing to participate in an activity and moving or taking something away or back

synonym: retreat, pullback, escape

deposit

 a sum of money or materials placed or kept in a bank, safety deposit box, or other secure places for safekeeping; a layer of rock, sand, or other material left behind by a flowing liquid or eroding force

mayor

 an elected official who presides over a city or town government

synonym: governor, leader, chief executive

investigation

 the act or process of thoroughly examining a crime, problem, statement, etc., to uncover the truth

embezzle

v. to dishonestly take or steal money or property that one has been entrusted with, especially by one's employer or another authority

hero

 a person who is admired or idealized for courage, outstanding achievements, or noble qualities; a character in literature or history who is central to the plot and who exhibits heroic qualities

documentary

fame

the condition of being well-known and discussed by a large number of people as a result of one's accomplishments, abilities, and so on

a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

stalk

to follow or track someone or something closely and quietly, usually to cause harm or surveillance; to move slowly and quietly to avoid detection; (noun) the main stem of a plant that supports leaves, flowers, and fruit; the stem or main axis of a support structure or framework

synonym: follow, creep up on, (noun) stem

(1) **stalk** of celery, (2) **stalk** from the room The hunter quietly stalked the deer for hours before taking the shot

fantastic

adj. extremely good; excellent synonym: incredible, unbelievable, marvelous

cultivate

- to prepare and foster land for growing crops or plants synonym: boost, foster, nurture

to not give or grant something due, expected, or requested

synonym: retain, hold back, keep back

addition

 the act or process of adding something to something else; the process of adding numbers

synonym: accumulation, expansion, addendum

peter

 ν . to fail or lose power, efficiency, or value gradually before coming to an end

synonym: decrease, drop, lower

hire

v. to give somebody a job

synonym: employ, engage, lease

(1) hire a guide, (2) hire a car by the hour

We should always be prepared to hire talented recruits.

transmit

 to send or forward an electronic signal; to pass something from one person or thing to another

synonym: convey, share, dispatch

disease

 a disorder or illness that affects the body or mind, often characterized by specific symptoms or abnormal functioning of organs or systems

syphilis

 a sexually transmitted disease caused by the bacterium Treponema pallidum, characterized by multiple stages and a wide range of symptoms
