#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

*synonym*: cause, factor, element

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

#### demigod

 a being with traits that are partly divine and partly human; a person who is highly regarded or celebrated, often with extraordinary abilities or achievements

synonym: half-god, superhuman

(1) ancient **demigod**, (2) musical **demigod** 

The founder was treated like a tech **demigod** in the startup ecosystem because of his successful ventures.

#### autocratic

adj. having absolute power and forcing people to obey completely without asking

synonym: domineering, omnipotent, authoritarian

(1) in an **autocratic** manner, (2) **autocratic** regimes

That emperor amended the law to allow him to continue his **autocratic** rule even after he abdicated.

#### dictator

 a political leader who has complete power over a country, especially one who has obtained control by force

*synonym*: autocrat, tyrant, despot

(1) military **dictator**, (2) a **dictator** with enormous powers A popular uprising led to the overthrow of the **dictator**.

abolish

- v. to do away with completely; to put an end to synonym: cancel, repeal, annul
- abolish slavery, (2) abolish censorship
   The government voted to abolish the outdated law.

#### rehearsal

n. a practice session, usually for a performance or presentation, during which people prepare and fine-tune their performance, often with the help of feedback from others; the act of rehearsing

synonym: practice, run-through, drill

(1) dress rehearsal, (2) music rehearsal

The theater company had its final **rehearsal** before opening night.

#### reclaim

 to take back something previously lost, given, or paid, or ask to have it back

synonym: recoup, regain, retake

(1) **reclaim** a competitive position, (2) **reclaim** land from the sea

You may be entitled to **reclaim** some tax.
