succumb

v. to fail to oppose something, such as desire, pressure, or some other opposing force; to die or suffer badly from the effect of a disease or injury

synonym: surrender, break down, die

(1) **succumb** to cancer, (2) **succumb** to old age He finally **succumbed** to temptation.

metastatic

adj. used to describe cancer cells that have spread from the primary site of origin to other parts of the body through the bloodstream or lymphatic system

synonym: spreading, invasive, secondary

(1) **metastatic** disease, (2) **metastatic** spreading **Metastatic** cancer has spread from its original site to other body parts.

distal

adj. situated away from the center of the body or structure; farthest from the point of attachment or origin

synonym: remote, distant, far-off

(1) distal tubule, (2) distal phalanx

The **distal** end of the bone is further away from the body's center.

circulatory

adj. relating to the system that moves blood through the body, which includes the heart, arteries, and veins

synonym: circulative, rotating

(1) a circulatory disease, (2) cause circulatory failure shock

The **circulatory** system of the animal is also responsible for heat transportation.

lymph

- a colorless fluid containing white blood cells that carry waste matter away from body tissue and help to prevent infections from spreading
- (1) lymph vessel, (2) lymph flow

There was a massive swelling of the **lymph** nodes.

nod

to lower and raise one's head, sometimes several times, as to show approval, agreement, greeting, or confirmation

synonym: respond, acknowledge, greet

- (1) **nod** at each other, (2) **nod** courteously She **nodded** quietly in response to the question.
- to surgically remove part or all of an organ, bone, or resect other tissue

synonym: excise, remove, cut out

(1) resect tumor, (2) resect the colon

The surgeon had to resect a portion of the patient's lung due to cancerous growth.

collagen

a fibrous protein that forms the connective tissues in n. animals, including skin, tendons, and bone; often used in cosmetic and medical treatments for its ability to add firmness and elasticity to skin or other tissues

synonym: gelatin, protein, tissue

(1) collagen supplement, (2) collagen production Our natural **collagen** production decreases as we age, leading to wrinkles, sagging skin, and joint pain.

hypothesize

v. to form or present a theory or explanation without sufficient evidence; to speculate

synonym: speculate, theorize, conjecture

(1) **hypothesize** as to outcomes, (2) **hypothesize** what could have happened

Scientists **hypothesize** that the new fish species evolved to survive in deep-sea environments.

obsess

 to fill the mind of someone continually so that one can't think of anything else

synonym: torment, beset, engross

(1) **obsess** over her weight, (2) he is **obsessed** with the fear

He's utterly **obsessed** with his promotion.

institutionalize

 to establish or make something a part of an institution (= a place such as a university, hospital, etc.)

synonym: formalize, establish, regularize

(1) **institutionalize** a system, (2) **institutionalize** customary laws

The new policy aims to **institutionalize** the use of renewable energy sources.

conceive

v. to have or develop an idea, a plan, etc. in mind; to become pregnant

synonym: imagine, envision, concoct

(1) **conceive** of an idea, (2) **conceive** a child I can't **conceive** he'd want to harm us.

preclinical

- adj. of or relating to the early phases of a disease when an accurate diagnosis is not possible because symptoms of the disease have not yet appeared; of or relating to the first stage of a medical education
- (1) **preclinical** diagnosis, (2) **preclinical** safety evaluation The doctor suspected that the patient was in the **preclinical** stage of Alzheimer's disease.

tocilizumab

- a medication used to treat inflammatory conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, giant cell arteritis, and cytokine release syndrome
- (1) administer **tocilizumab**, (2) **tocilizumab** treatment The patient experienced **tocilizumab** side effects which included dizziness and headaches.

rheumatoid

 a chronic, inflammatory autoimmune disorder that primarily affects the joints, causing pain, swelling, and stiffness; it can also cause damage to other parts of the body

synonym: arthritis, joint inflammation, rheumatism

(1) **rheumatoid** disease, (2) **rheumatoid** factor My aunt suffers from **rheumatoid** arthritis and has trouble moving her joints.

byproduct

- a secondary or incidental product produced in the manufacture or synthesis of something else
 synonym: side effect, spinoff, outgrowth
- (1) toxic **byproducts**, (2) **byproduct** of technology

 The **byproduct** of the energy production process is a large amount of carbon dioxide emissions.

superhuman

- adj. possessing abilities or characteristics that exceed those of normal humans; beyond human capacity or capabilitysynonym: supernatural, inhuman, beyond human
- (1) **superhuman** beings, (2) **superhuman** effort The athlete's **superhuman** strength allowed him to lift twice his body weight.

avenge

 to get revenge or seek retribution for a perceived wrong or injury, often in the form of punishment, retaliation, or vindication

synonym: retaliate, revenge, requite

(1) **avenge** a friend, (2) **avenge** an injustice He sought to **avenge** his brother's death by seeking justice through the legal system.

sidekick

 a person who is closely associated with and supports another person, especially in a work or professional capacity; a person who is a close and loyal companion

synonym: companion, helper, ally

(1) a detective's **sidekick**, (2) his best friend's **sidekick** The superhero's **sidekick** was always there to help him.

anticancer

adj. relating to the prevention, treatment, or cure of cancer; possessing properties that are thought to prevent or combat cancer

synonym: cancer-fighting, cancer-preventive

(1) effective **anticancer** drug, (2) **anticancer** therapy Scientists have discovered certain plants with **anticancer** properties that could help treat cancer.

groundbreaking

adj. producing fresh findings; using novel techniques *synonym*: innovative, revolutionary

(1) **groundbreaking** concept, (2) **groundbreaking** settlement

He has produced groundbreaking research on the subject.

invade

v. to enter aggressively into another's territory by military force for conquest and occupation

synonym: intrude, raid, overrun

(1) **invade** other tissues, (2) **invade** his privacy. I have no intention to **invade** your privacy.

wrath

n. extreme anger

synonym: fury, irritation, anger

(1) **wrath** of God, (2) a high person's **wrath**He finally exploded with **wrath** due to the team's repeated failures.

superpower

 a country or nation that has significant global influence or formidable military, economic, or technological strength; a supernatural ability or force capable of extraordinary feats or feats beyond normal human

capabilities

synonym: great power, empire, hegemony

(1) **superpower** country, (2) **superpower** leader
