v. to acknowledge or realize something or someone; to identify, remember, or become aware of something that was previously known or encountered

synonym: acknowledge, identify, admit

(1) **recognize** talent, (2) **recognize** achievement It's important to **recognize** your strengths and weaknesses.

#### murder

- n. the crime of killing somebody intentionallysynonym: slaying, killing
- murder in the second degree, (2) attempted murder
   This intriguing murder mystery remains unsolved.

#### commit

- v. to do something illegal or wrong synonym: engage, carry out, execute
- (1) commit suicide, (2) commit mistakesThe military has committed an abuse of human rights.

#### confess

v. to admit to having done something wrong or to reveal something personal or private

synonym: admit, acknowledge, own up

(1) confess sin, (2) confess truth

He **confessed** to his crime and turned himself into the police.

#### forensic

adj. relating to the use of scientific methods and techniques to investigate and solve crimes or legal disputes; pertaining to or involved in legal or criminal proceedings; using scientific evidence to support a claim or argument in a court of law or other formal settings

synonym: legal, juridical, judicial

(1) find **forensic** evidence, (2) **forensic** team

**Forensic** scientists analyzed the DNA evidence to solve the crime.

### develop

v. to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) **develop** a strategy, (2) **develop** a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

### psychology

- n. the scientific study of mind and behavior
- (1) **psychology** experiment, (2) **psychology** of crowd She had a master's degree in **psychology**.

#### conduct

- v. to organize and carry out a particular activity synonym: behave, lead, carry on
- (1) **conduct** a background check, (2) **conduct** research Police will **conduct** random breath testing for drunk driving.

#### **function**

n. the purpose or use of an object, system, or process; a particular activity or operation that is designed to serve a specific purpose; a mathematical concept that describes a relationship between two sets of values, called the input and output sets; (verb) to operate or work in a specific way, or to perform a particular task or purpose

synonym: purpose, mapping, job

(1) function properly, (2) immune function

The brain is an incredibly complex organ that controls the body's **function**.

#### interrogate

v. to examine someone with questions over a lengthy period, especially in an aggressive manner

*synonym*: question, examine, probe

(1) **interrogate** an enemy soldier, (2) **interrogated** by police The lawyer spent considerable time to adequately **interrogate** the witness.

#### intellect

 the ability to think logically and comprehend information, especially at an advanced level

synonym: mind, brightness, cleverness

(1) enrich my **intellect**, (2) human **intellect**Your **intellect** is capable of distinguishing among similar objects.

### disability

- a physical or mental condition that makes it difficult for someone to do some things that other people do
   synonym: impairment, disadvantage, restriction
- (1) a **disability** pension, (2) a learning **disability**Listening to music at a high volume may lead to a hearing **disability**.

#### snippet

- n. a small piece or brief extract of somethingsynonym: fragment, excerpt, brief
- snippet of wisdom, (2) code snippet
   The journalist saved a snippet of the interview for later reference.

#### honesty

the quality of being truthful, sincere, and morally upright;
 adherence to moral and ethical principles

*synonym*: sincerity, integrity, truthfulness

(1) honesty policy, (2) honesty box

A culture of **honesty** in the workplace leads to better communication and productivity.

bat

n. a nocturnal animal with wings that flies and feeds at night, similar to a mouse; a piece of wood with a handle used for hitting the ball in sports including baseball, cricket, and table tennis

synonym: cane, rod, stick

(1) bat cave, (2) bat an eye

The cave was a habitat for **bats**.

nod

v. to lower and raise one's head, sometimes several times, as to show approval, agreement, greeting, or confirmation

synonym: respond, acknowledge, greet

(1) **nod** at each other, (2) **nod** courteously

She **nodded** quietly in response to the question.

#### convinced

adj. completely certain about something; having a strong belief or conviction in a particular religion

synonym: confident, positive, indoctrinated

(1) **convinced** of the idea, (2) **convinced** criminal

The public is **convinced** that the prime minister has committed fraud.

guilt

 the fact of having committed something illegal; the negative feelings caused by believing or knowing that you have done something wrong

synonym: regret, remorse, blame

(1) criminal guilt, (2) feeling of guilt

Shame and **guilt** have significant social influences.

#### confession

 a formal statement in which one admits that they have done something wrong or illegal

synonym: admission, avowal, acknowledgment

(1) a **confession** of guilt, (2) a **confession** of faith The prisoner made a full **confession** and admitted to his crime.

#### definitely

adv. without any question and beyond doubt; clearly synonym: absolutely, certainly, indeed

(1) **definitely** become a problem, (2) say **definitely** The paper is **definitely** worth reading thoroughly.

### eventually

adv. finally, particularly after a long time or a lot of struggle, complications, and so on

*synonym*: finally, someday, ultimately

(1) eventually become obsolete, (2) eventually succeed The corporation **eventually** dominated the entire tobacco business.

#### convict

- to prove or declare someone to be guilty of a crime; (noun) a person serving a sentence in a jail or prison *synonym*: condemn, sentence, judge
- (1) **convict** him of manslaughter, (2) **convict** in a jail He was **convicted** on fraud charges and sentenced to five years in prison.

#### assault

- a violent physical attack; the crime of forcing someone to submit to sexual intercourse against their will synonym: assault, attack, raid
- (1) assault aircraft, (2) victim of sexual assault
- We got caught up in an assault case.

### judge

a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

synonym: arbiter, justice, (verb) deduce

(1) judge a competition, (2) an associate judge The strict **judge** ruled in favor of the plaintiff in the case.

overturn

- to turn something upside down; to upset synonym: flip over, upset, topple
- (1) **overturn** a decision, (2) **overturn** a table The court **overturned** the original verdict.

#### conviction

n. a strong belief or opinion, especially one that is based on principles or evidence; (criminal law) a final judgment of guilty in a criminal case and the punishment that is imposed

synonym: belief, certainty, faith

(1) moral **conviction**, (2) **conviction** for murder She spoke with **conviction** about the importance of education.

#### intense

adj. (especially of a feeling) very strong; extremely sharp or severe

*synonym*: extreme, fierce, harsh

(1) **intense** heat, (2) develop **intense** itching That statement by the prime minister drew **intense** international criticism.

#### assume

 to think or accept something to be true without having proof of it; to take or begin to have power; to begin to exhibit a specific quality or appearance

synonym: guess, presume, suppose

(1) **assume** a lousy attitude to his boss, (2) **assume** an important role

The following example **assumes** that the capacity of each battery is the same.

### illegal

adj. not allowed by law

synonym: banned, prohibited, illicit

(1) **illegal** drugs, (2) child of **illegal** immigrants The customs agents seized the **illegal** shipment.

#### outcry

- n. a strong expression of public protest, anger, or dissentsynonym: protest, objection, dissent
- (1) a great outcry, (2) national outcry

The **outcry** against the new policy was heard loud and clear by the government.

#### injustice

- n. a violation of the rights of others or the laws of a societysynonym: unfairness, bias, discrimination
- (1) gross injustice, (2) injustice system

The **injustice** of the court's decision angered many people and led to protests.

#### individual

- n. a single person or thing, as distinct from a group synonym: person, being, self
- (1) a private **individual**, (2) **individual** freedom
  As an **individual**, he had the right to make his own decisions and live his life as he saw fit.

### approximately

adv. close to a specific number or time but not exactly that number or time

*synonym*: about, around, roughly

- (1) **approximately** 3 feet long, (2) **approximately** same This trail takes **approximately** 2.5 hours.
- peer n. a person who has the same age, status, or ability synonym: fellow, associate, counterpart
  - (1) peer group, (2) peer review

Among young people, **peer** pressure can be pretty influential.

#### arrest

v. to take into custody

*synonym*: capture, detain, imprison

(1) arrest the thief, (2) arrest the progress

A police officer has the authority to **arrest** a criminal.

#### statistics

- the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data
- (1) **statistics** for cancer, (2) official **statistics**The **statistics** demonstrate that poverty and unemployment are genuine problems.

### technique

a particular way or art of doing something that needs skill

synonym:

approach, procedure, strategy

(1) a **technique** in martial arts, (2) the **technique** applied to construction

Jockey's superior **technique** brought him victory.

#### struggle

v. to make a great effort to do something when it is difficult, or there are a lot of problems; to use force or violence to break away from restraint or constriction

synonym: toil, strive, compete

(1) **struggle** against discrimination, (2) **struggle** to get the job

He could not **struggle** against temptation.

### shocking

adj. extremely or surprisingly bad, or causing a strong emotional response such as surprise or disgustsynonym: startling, surprising, astounding

(1) **shocking** response, (2) **shocking** revelation

The news of the accident was **shocking** and left many in

shock.

#### counterintuitive

adj. contrary to what common sense would suggest synonym: unreasonable, paradoxical, nonsensical

(1) **counterintuitive** results, (2) **counterintuitive** behavior The **counterintuitive** nature of quantum physics has been a source of confusion for scientists for decades.

#### gruesome

adj. causing horror or disgustsynonym: appalling, horrific, terrible

(1) hear **gruesome** details, (2) **gruesome** accident The **gruesome** crime scene was difficult for the detectives to stomach.

### horrify

v. to shock or disgust greatly synonym: shock, dismay, terrify

(1) horrify audience, (2) horrify victims

The series of terrorist attacks horrify the entire nation.

rap

a type of music characterized by a strong, repetitive beat and lyrics that often focus on social and political issues; a reproach for some lapse or misdeed

synonym: hip-hop, emceeing, MCing

(1) rap music, (2) get a rap

The new **rap** album is getting a lot of attention.

precise

adj. sharply exact or accurate or delimited synonym: accurate, exact, distinct

(1) **precise** analyses, (2) estimate **precise** costs The content is **precise** and informative for me.

exonerate

to clear someone of blame or accusation; to free someone from responsibility or guilt

synonym: absolve, clear, acquit

(1) **exonerate** from blame, (2) **exonerate** the defendant The DNA evidence **exonerated** the suspect, proving his innocence.

innocent

crystal

adj. not guilty of a crime, offense, etc.; not having an evil mind or knowledge

synonym: blameless, honest, harmless

- (1) an **innocent** child, (2) thousands of **innocent** people My husband was found **innocent** of any crime.
- a solid material with many even sides that is formed naturally when the substance becomes solid and has a highly regular atomic structure; clear and colorless glass made of almost pure silica

synonym: quartz

(1) liquid **crystal**, (2) **crystal** analyses

A vast **crystal** chandelier glittered brightly above us.

quarter

- one of four equal parts; a fourth part or portion *synonym*: fourth, one-fourth
- (1) a quarter mile, (2) end of the first quarter

The unemployment rate in the first quarter was 2.3

percentage points higher than in the previous.

#### countless

adj. too numerous to be counted or very manysynonym: innumerable, myriad, numerous

(1) **countless** hours, (2) answer **countless** questions There are **countless** methods for dealing with stress.

#### vulnerable

adj. capable of being hurt or influenced physically or mentally

synonym: susceptible, exposed, weak

(1) a **vulnerable** bridge, (2) **vulnerable** parts of the body Infants and pregnant women are particularly **vulnerable**.

#### juvenile

adj. relating to or characteristic of youth or young people; immature

synonym: youthful, boyish, childlike

(1) exhibit **juvenile** behavior, (2) **juvenile** justice

The detective suspected that the vandalism was the work of **juvenile** delinquents.

#### instance

- n. a particular example or single occurrence of somethingsynonym: example, sample, illustration
- (1) for **instance**, (2) notable **instance**These articles cite five **instances** of climate change.

#### resolve

- v. to find a suitable answer to the problems or difficulty synonym: decide, determine, fix
- (1) **resolve** a dispute, (2) **resolve** the computer error This company **resolves** its battery problem completely.

#### guilty

adj. feeling responsible for or having done something wrong or criminal

synonym: culpable, blameworthy, at fault

(1) feel a bit **guilty**, (2) **guilty** verdict

After much contemplation, the suspect decided to plead **guilty** to the theft charge.

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#### plea

 an appeal or request, especially for help or understanding; a legal excuse or defense; an earnest entreaty or supplication

synonym: petition, appeal, entreaty

(1) plea bargaining, (2) emotional plea

The defendant entered a **plea** of not guilty during his trial.

#### headline

 a heading at the top of a newspaper or magazine story or page

synonym: title, caption

(1) headline article, (2) banner headline

The engagement of the two golf players became **headline** news.

#### norm

- n. something that is regarded as usual, typical, or standardsynonym: criterion, mean, standard
- (1) **norm** of action, (2) cultural **norm**

The systems we have developed has accepted as industry **norms**.

#### typical

adj. having the usual characteristics or traits of a specific group of things

synonym: characteristic, usual, distinctive

(1) **typical** leader, (2) fairly **typical** symptoms

This artwork is **typical** of her work.

#### involve

v. to include or affect someone or something as a necessary part of something else

synonym: implicate, include, engage

(1) **involve** a lot of paperwork, (2) **involve** a high degree of risk

The investigation **involves** several government agencies and is expected to take several months.

### appeal

 a serious, earnest, or urgent request for money, information, or help; a quality that makes somebody or something attractive or interest synonym: request, charm, attraction

(1) draw out your **appeal**, (2) an **appeal** for help

He needed to resolve the problem as soon as possible, so he made an **appeal** directly.

refer

v. to direct someone's attention, thoughts, or questions to another source or person; to mention, cite, or allude to something as evidence or support

synonym: cite, allude, mention

(1) refer to a book, (2) refer to a map

Please **refer** to the instruction manual for further assistance.

tip

n. the top or extreme point of something slender or tapering, usually a mountain or hill; a piece of advice about something practical; a small amount of money given for services

*synonym*: edge, advice, gratuity

(1) the **tip** of a paintbrush, (2) give the waiter a **tip**.

I will introduce some **tips** on learning English in this class.

iceberg

a large piece of ice floating in the sea, detached from a glacier

synonym: glacier, ice mass, floe

(1) hit an iceberg, (2) iceberg melting

The ship encountered a series of **icebergs** and had to change its course.

alarming

 adj. causing concern or apprehension; causing a feeling of danger, harm, or emergency; unsettling or disturbing

synonym: forbidding, concerning, disturbing

(1) alarming news, (2) alarming statistics

The sudden rise in crime rates in our neighborhood is quite alarming.

incarcerate

 to put or keep somebody in prison or in a place from which they cannot escape

*synonym*: confine, detain, imprison

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(1) **incarcerate** the murderer, (2) **incarcerate** her for life He was **incarcerated** for the duration of the war.

#### blatant

- adj. completely obvious, often offensively or inappropriately;characterized by shameless or brazen behaviorsynonym: obvious, flagrant, conspicuous
- (1) **blatant** hypocrisy, (2) **blatant** disregard Fact-checkers quickly exposed the politician's **blatant** lie.

### fingerprint

- n. a unique pattern of ridges and valleys on the surface of a finger that can be used to identify a personsynonym: print, mark, impression
- (1) **fingerprint** at a crime scene, (2) **fingerprint** identification

The police used a **fingerprint** scanner to identify the suspect.

lye

 a highly alkaline solution made by soaking hardwood ashes in the water, used in the production of soap, detergents, and other cleaning agents; a caustic substance

synonym: caustic soda, sodium hydroxide, alkaline solution

(1) **lye** soap, (2) **lye** water

The drain cleaner contains caustic **lye**, and should be handled with care.

#### suspect

- v. to consider anything to be actual or probable synonym: assume, distrust, surmise
- (1) **suspect** a plot, (2) **suspect** that he is sick The cops **suspected** him of being the killer.

ban

- v. to officially or legally forbid or refuse to allow something synonym: forbid, prohibit, restrict
- (1) **ban** gender-related job discrimination, (2) **ban** any type of cloning

We should **ban** mildly violent video games from a child's development perspective.

#### impair

- v. to damage something or make it weaker or worse synonym: degrade, mar, deface
- (1) **impair** my health, (2) **impair** insulin sensitivity The accident made his vision **impaired**.

#### threaten

 to utter intentions of injury or punishment against someone

*synonym*: endanger, terrorize, intimidate

(1) **threaten** a healthy relationship, (2) **threaten** national security

Various artificially induced causes are **threatening** our ecosystem.

### possibility

- n. a chance that something may happen or be truesynonym: chance, prospect, likelihood
- (1) **possibility** for growth, (2) **possibility** of a major earthquake

The **possibility** of getting the disease will drastically increase.

jail

 a facility where criminals are kept to be punished for their crimes; a prison

synonym: prison, slammer, penitentiary

(1) county jail, (2) be in jail

The police escorted the prisoner to the **jail**.

#### maxim

 a well-known phrase that expresses a general or fundamental truth, principle, or rule for behavior

synonym: adage, proverb, aphorism

(1) old **maxim**, (2) act upon a **maxim** 

A good **maxim** is never out of season.

#### strategy

 a detailed plan of action designed to achieve a long-term or overall goal.

synonym: approach, procedure, scenario

(1) military **strategy**, (2) develop a **strategy** 

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Our plan includes a comprehensive marketing **strategy**.

#### denial

- n. a statement that something is not true or does not existsynonym: refusal, rejection, veto
- state of denial, (2) an absolute denial
   She gave us a categorical denial of the scandal.

### pointless

adj. having no purpose or reason; serving no useful function; meaningless or senseless

synonym: meaningless, purposeless, worthless

(1) **pointless** argument, (2) **pointless** task

The meeting was considered **pointless** since nothing was accomplished.

#### susceptible

adj. easily influenced, harmed, or affected by something synonym: exposed, liable, gullible

(1) a **susceptible** young woman, (2) **susceptible** of proof Well-stretched muscles are less **susceptible** to injury.

#### influence

 the ability to affect someone's or something's character, growth, or behavior, or the effect itself

synonym: power, leverage, effect

(1) **influence** a child's future, (2) **influence** the daily life The former emperor had a particular **influence** even after he abdicated.

### accusation

 a statement or claim alleging that someone has committed a crime, offense, or wrongdoing; a charge or indictment made against someone

*synonym*: charge, indictment, imputation

(1) criminal accusation, (2) false accusation

The **accusation** of theft was unfounded, and the suspect was eventually cleared of all charges.

#### befriend

v. to become a friend of someone, especially when in need synonym: support, advise, patronize

(1) **befriend** a young boy, (2) **befriend** other members I'm willing to **befriend** the weak and the poor.

#### indicate

v. to show, point out, or make known something, often through a sign or a symbol; to suggest or imply something without stating it directly

synonym: hint, suggest, show

(1) **indicate** a preference, (2) **indicate** an error The data **indicates** that the company's profits have steadily increased over the past quarter.

desire

- n. a strong feeling of wanting to have or do somethingsynonym: ambition, appetite, greed
- (1) unsatisfied **desire**, (2) fleshly **desire**Low sexual **desire** typically correlates with low testosterone levels.

### minimize

 to make something, especially something bad, small or less serious

synonym: diminish, mitigate, belittle

(1) **minimize** a loss, (2) way to **minimize** conflict I bought a gadget before my trip to help **minimize** stress during the flight.

convey

v. to express ideas, feelings, etc. so that it is known or understood by other people; to carry something from one place to another

synonym: communicate, transfer, deliver

(1) **convey** a complex idea, (2) **convey** goods by truck An ironic remark often **conveys** an intended meaning obliquely.

### sympathy

 n. the feeling of being sorry for someone who is experiencing a difficult or unpleasant situation; understanding or sharing someone else's feelings or emotions

synonym: compassion, empathy, understanding

### (1) sympathy card, (2) feel sympathy

I expressed my **sympathy** to my friend after her cat passed away.

#### imply

v. to indicate the truth or existence of something without referring to it

synonym: hint, indicate, denote

(1) **imply** a strong correlation, (2) **imply** the presence of alien

The salespeople speak in technical terms to **imply** that they are more knowledgeable than the customer.

#### **lenient**

adj. not harsh or strict; tolerant; forgiving; allowing for freedom or flexibility

synonym: permissive, indulgent, easygoing

(1) **lenient** punishment, (2) **lenient** rules

The teacher was **lenient** with the deadline for the project, giving the students extra time to finish.

#### classic

adj. judged or deserving to be regarded as one of the best or most important of its kind over a period of time; of a well-known type

synonym: definitive, traditional, typical

(1) a **classic** experiment, (2) Chinese **classic** literature He displayed the **classic** symptoms of depression.

### oversimplify

- to describe or explain something in a way that is too simple and no longer holds true
- (1) **oversimplify** the problem, (2) **oversimplify** a complex reality

People may **oversimplify** natural phenomena due to the improved accessibility of knowledge.

#### hint

 an indirect suggestion; a slight but appreciable amount of something

synonym: clue, indication, suggestion

### (1) hint of trouble, (2) helpful hints

There was no **hint** of a problem.

#### leniency

the quality of being kind or merciful in the administration of punishment

*synonym*: mercy, clemency, compassion

(1) show leniency, (2) leniency in sentencing

The judge showed **leniency** towards the first-time offender and gave him a lighter sentence.

#### adolescent

 a young person who is in the process of developing from a child into an adult

synonym: teen, preadult, youth

(1) **adolescent** girl, (2) pre- **adolescent** children Timely education about birth control might help reduce **adolescent** pregnancies.

#### evaluate

v. to assess or estimate the quality, significance, quantity, or value of something

synonym: assess, estimate, consider

(1) **evaluate** the grant proposal, (2) **evaluate** a situation The meeting aims to **evaluate** possible choices.

#### reward

*n*. a thing given in acknowledgment of service, hard work, achievement, etc.

*synonym*: compensation, gratuity, bonus

(1) the **reward** for good works, (2) shopping **rewards** cards Night fishing has a lot of **rewards**.

### immediate

adj. happening or done without delay or occurring shortly after something else

*synonym*: prompt, quick, instantaneous

(1) take **immediate** effect, (2) the **immediate** past Both forts were subject to **immediate** attacks.

#### unpleasant

adj. not enjoyable or comfortable

synonym:

disagreeable, displeasing, distasteful

(1) **unpleasant** behavior, (2) with **unpleasant** body odor It is **unpleasant** to see criminal behavior even though it is minor.

#### punishment

 a penalty or consequence inflicted for wrongdoing or offense; a means of enforcing discipline or preventing further wrongdoing

synonym: penalty, discipline, retribution

(1) **punishment** for a crime, (2) humiliating **punishment** The judge gave severe **punishment** to the criminal who committed the heinous crime.

### strength

victim

 the quality or state of being physically, or sometimes mentally, strong

synonym: resilience, power, muscles

- (1) **strength** of the economy, (2) muscular **strength** Health and **strength** are, above all, gold.
- a person who has been harmed, injured, or otherwise negatively affected by a particular action, circumstance, or event

synonym: prey, target, sufferer

(1) **victim** support, (2) **victim** compensation

The **victim** of the crime deserves justice and support to recover from the trauma.

#### witness

a person who sees something happen, especially a crime or an accident

synonym: onlooker, attestant, bystander

- witness of the car accident, (2) a material witness
   The manufacturing industry is witnessing fierce competition.
- a piece of clothing worn on the hand and wrist for protection against cold, dirt, etc., with separate parts for each finger

*synonym*: mitt

### glove

(1) a right-hand **glove**, (2) 5-finger **glove**She was wearing a black **glove**.

#### neuroscience

- the scientific study of the function, structure, and disorder of the brain and the nervous system
- (1) the branch of **neuroscience**, (2) a theoretical concept in **neuroscience**

Our university is famous for its professors, who are well-versed in behavioral **neuroscience**.

#### brain

- the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling
- synonym: intellect, mind, encephalon
- (1) basic **brain** function, (2) permanent **brain** damage X-rays revealed a small tumor in his **brain**.

#### anatomical

adj. of or relating to the structure of the body and its parts synonym: physical, bodily, structural

(1) **anatomical** structure, (2) **anatomical** elements

The **anatomical** model of the human body was used to teach medical students.

#### structure

 the way of construction of something and the arrangement of its parts, or a complex thing constructed of many parts

synonym: construction, architecture, establishment

(1) the **structure** of a machine, (2) **structure** and function of the brain

The organizational **structure** of start-ups is often flat and straightforward.

### prefrontal

- adj. in or about the foremost part of the frontal lobe of the brain
