opportune

bewilder

flub

facet

 one of the many aspects or sides of a subject or situation, especially when seen from different angles or perspectives; a particular feature or characteristic of something

synonym: aspect, side, angle

limitless

adj. without end, limit, or boundary; infinite *synonym*: boundless, infinite, unrestricted

The possibilities for scientific discovery are **limitless**.

autopilot

a system that automatically controls the operation of an aircraft or spacecraft

synonym: self-pilot, self-driving, self-navigating

(1) autopilot function, (2) aircraft autopilot

The airplane was on **autopilot** during the long flight.

paralysis

 a condition in which you are unable to move or lose control of part or most of the body because of illness or injury

synonym: immobility, stiffness, palsy

(1) moral **paralysis**, (2) **paralysis** in the leg

Massive demonstrations lead to total **paralysis** of transportation.

dribble

to allow a liquid or substance to flow slowly and steadily in small drops; to move a ball or object in a series of small bounces or taps, often while running or maneuvering around other players

synonym: trickle, drizzle, drop

choreograph
