stifle

v. to suppress or restrain something, particularly a feeling, emotion, or action; to suffocate or prevent proper breathing or ventilation

synonym: smother, suppress, suffocate

(1) stifle a laugh, (2) stifle creativity

The oppressive regime tried to **stifle** free speech and dissent.

humiliate

v. to cause someone to feel ashamed, embarrassed, or degraded, especially in public or through revealing personal information

synonym: shame, embarrass, degrade

(1) **humiliate** him publicly, (2) **humiliate** the heckler in the audience

The boss **humiliated** her employee by belittling her in front of her colleagues.

cofounder

- one of several people who establishes an organization or starts a business
- cofounder of the university, (2) late cofounder
 He is the cofounder and chairman of this tech company.

exorcism

 the act of forcibly driving out an evil spirit or demon from a person or place, typically through a ritualistic ceremony or prayer

synonym: purification, cleansing, dispossession

(1) exorcism ceremony, (2) demonic exorcism

The priest performed an **exorcism** to rid the haunted house of its evil spirits.

devote

v. to commit or dedicate oneself or one's time, effort, or energy to a particular task or purpose

synonym: commit, dedicate, apply

(1) **devote** all of my energies, (2) **devote** my own life He **devoted** himself to studying the history of ancient civilizations.

sham

 something that is not as good or true as it seems to be and is intended to deceive people; a person who pretends to be something they are not

synonym: bogus, counterfeit, fraudulent

(1) a **sham** battle, (2) turn out to be all **sham** The data he prepared was completely **sham**.

embarrass

- v. to cause someone to feel awkward, worried, or ashamed synonym: disconcert, unsettle, agitate
- (1) **embarrass** political enemy, (2) **embarrass** my project He looked for an opportunity to **embarrass** that actor in public.

opportune

- adj. suitable or happening at a time that is suitable or convenient for a particular purpose
- synonym: suitable, timely, practical
- (1) **opportune** occasion, (2) an **opportune** remark The phone rang at the most **opportune** time.

empathy

- the ability to share another person's feelings or experiences by imagining that person's situation
- synonym: compassion, sympathy, tenderness
- (1) full of **empathy**, (2) **empathy** for patients **Empathy** is also necessary to understand history.

postpone

- v. to delay or reschedule something to a later time or date synonym: delay, defer, reschedule
- (1) **postpone** meeting, (2) **postpone** event Due to inclement weather, the game has been **postponed** until next week.

impostor

- someone who pretends to be someone or something else to deceive others; a fraud

impostor sellers trying to scam them.

discotheque
