errand

a short trip that is taken to perform a specified task, such as to take a message or to take or collect something

synonym: task, chore

(1) **errand** boy, (2) run an **errand**

He sent me on an errand.

overseer

a person who supervises or directs the work of others; a guardian or keeper of something

synonym: supervisor, manager, superintendent

(1) **overseer** of a plantation, (2) production **overseer** The **overseer** of the construction project was responsible for

ensuring everything was done on time and within budget.

fugitive

a person who is running away or hiding from the law, often to avoid arrest or prosecution

synonym: escapee, runaway, deserter

(1) **fugitive** from justice, (2) **fugitive** methane emissions The police are searching for the fugitive who escaped from prison.

enslave

to make someone a slave; to deprive someone of their freedom of choice or action

synonym: coerce, deprive, imprison

(1) **enslave** poor peasants, (2) **enslave** indigenous people Her beauty **enslaved** me completely.

narcolepsy

a chronic sleep disorder characterized by sudden and n. uncontrollable episodes of falling asleep during the day, often accompanied by cataplexy (loss of muscle control)

synonym: sleep attacks, rem sleep disorder

attacks

The **narcolepsy** symptoms include excessive daytime sleepiness and sleep paralysis.

rename

liberate

synonym: active, engaged, assiduous

abolitionist

synonym: antislavery activist, emancipator, liberator

scout
