### patient

### lump

#### breast

 either of the two round soft parts of a woman's chest which secrete milk after childbirth

synonym: bosom, chest, bust

#### harsh

adj. severe and unkind; extremely tough and unpleasant to inhabit

synonym: brutal, severe, backbreaking

(1) harsh climate, (2) use of harsh chemicals

The prime minister faced harsh criticism.

### chemotherapy

the treatment of disease, particularly cancer, using special drugs that have a toxic effect on cancer cells; frequently used in conjunction with other therapies such as surgery and radiation

*synonym*: anticancer treatment, radiotherapy, immunotherapy

(1) **chemotherapy** regimen, (2) **chemotherapy** side effects Many cancer patients undergo **chemotherapy** as a treatment option.

### surgery

medical treatment of injuries or diseases involving an incision with instruments and often removing or replacing some parts of the body; the branch of medical science that treats disease or injury by operative procedures

*synonym*: operation, (medical) procedure

(1) cardiac **surgery**, (2) the professor of **surgery** He had undergone heart **surgery** years before.

recover

- v. to return to a former condition, health, mind, or strength synonym: come back, convalesce, heal

### eager

adj. showing enthusiasm and a strong desire or interest to do something

synonym:

keen, enthusiastic, ardent

#### resume

- to continue or begin anew after a pause or interruption *synonym*: continue, reopen, restart
- (1) **resume** an office, (2) **resume** a relationship We **resumed** negotiations after a temporary break.

### eyebrow

- the hair arc over each eye in humans synonym: brow, supercilium
- (1) raise her **eyebrows**, (2) **eyebrow** cosmetics She raised an inquiring **eyebrow** towards me.

#### emotion

- a strong feeling such as love, anger, etc. deriving from n. one's situation, mood, or relationships with others *synonym*: feeling, sentiment, passion
- (1) control my **emotion**, (2) afraid to show **emotion** Some emotions are common across cultures and backgrounds.

#### afterward

adv. after the time mentioned synonym: later, thereafter, following

(1) a few years **afterward**, (2) go there **afterward** We will explain the countermeasure concerning this problem afterward.

#### relation

the way two persons or groups of people feel and act toward one another

*synonym*: association, linkage, connection

(1) **relation** between cause and effect, (2) **relation** of inclusion

#### reserve

v. to keep something for future use or contingency; to obtain or arrange something, such as a meeting, seat, etc., in advance

synonym: keep, hold, preserve

#### romantic

adj. of or relating to love or a sexual relationship synonym: idealistic, unrealistic, amatory

### propose

- v. to make a proposal, declare a plan for something synonym: suggest, offer, recommend
- (1) **propose** the amendment, (2) **propose** changes I want to **propose** a toast in honor of our longstanding relationship.

#### excitement

- n. a feeling of great enthusiasm and eagernesssynonym: thrill, exhilaration, incitement
- (1) the **excitement** in the business world, (2) aesthetic **excitement**

The **excitement** of the upcoming concert was palpable among the crowd.

#### shatter

- v. to break suddenly into many pieces synonym: break, crash, destroy

### breakup

 the end of a relationship between persons or nations;
 the separation of something into several pieces or sections

### incredibly

 adv. in a way that is very difficult to believe; exceedingly or extremely

synonym: enormously, exceptionally, extraordinarily

#### determinant

 a factor, circumstance, or condition that contributes to the shaping, influencing, or determining of a particular outcome or result

synonym: cause, factor, element

One **determinant** of success is having a positive attitude and a strong work ethic.

#### marshal

n. a military officer of high rank or a person in charge of organizing or leading a parade or public event; a law enforcement official or officer responsible for maintaining order and enforcing regulations; (verb) to organize, arrange, or gather together resources, information, or people in a deliberate and systematic manner

synonym: marshal, commander, organizer

#### emotional

#### flounder

v. to struggle or stumble awkwardly; to move or act clumsily or in confusion; to be in a difficult or uncertain situation

#### heartbreak

#### mechanism

#### miserable

adj. very unhappy, uncomfortable, or unpleasant; causing great distress or suffering

### background

n. the details of a person's social heritage, such as family, vocational or educational experience; past information

that is essential to understanding a situation or problem synonym: ground, experience, backdrop

- an inborn behavioral pattern that is often responsive to n. specific stimuli; an innate feeling that causes you to act or believe that something is true

synonym: intuition, aptitude, feeling

(1) **instinct** for self-preservation, (2) aggressive **instinct** When faced with a dangerous situation, his initial **instinct** was to flee.

adj. not different, exceptional, or unexpected in any way, especially in quality, ability, size, or degree

chase

compel

brain

 the organ inside the head that is responsible for one's movement, thought, memory, and feeling

withdrawal

 n. the act of taking money out of an account; the act of ceasing to participate in an activity and moving or taking something away or back

#### addict

 a person who cannot stop using or doing something as a habit, especially something harmful

synonym: devotee, buff, freak

#### withdraw

v. to remove or take back something; to stop participating in something

synonym: retract, remove, back out

#### substance

 the real physical material of which a thing or person consist; the most important or main part of some idea or experience; an illegal drug

cocaine

n. a highly addictive stimulant drug that is derived from the leaves of the coca plant, often used recreationally for its euphoric effects but also used in medicine as a local anesthetic and vasoconstrictor

### opioid

- n. substances that have an effect similar to opium, such as morphine, used in medicines to treat severe pain, but some people take them illegally for pleasure and become addicted

stalk

v. to refuse to accept something and attempt to prevent it from happening

synonym: fight, defy, revolt

#### hop

to jump lightly and quickly on one foot or both feet; to move rapidly from one place to another; to travel using an aircraft, bus, etc.

#### destructive

adj. causing or able to cause tremendous and irreparable damage

synonym: destroying, harmful, disastrous

### manipulate

v. to influence or control something or someone to your advantage, often in an unfair or dishonest way

#### absolute

adj. perfect or complete or to the most considerable degree possible

*synonym*: complete, infrangible, indisputable

### opposition

the act of disagreeing or resisting; the state of strong disagreement

synonym: resistance, hostility, antagonism

(1) **opposition** campaign, (2) meet with **opposition** The **opposition** party strongly disagreed with the government's proposed legislation.

#### remarkable

*adj.* worthy of attention because unusual or special *synonym*: outstanding, exceptional, extraordinary

(1) **remarkable** achievement, (2) the **remarkable** breadth of knowledge

The election was a **remarkable** success for the Whigs.

#### hike

 a long walk or journey, especially for pleasure or exercise; an increase in cost

synonym: walk, trek, excursion

(1) go on a hike, (2) a hike in prices

The family decided to **hike** in the mountains to enjoy the beautiful scenery.

### cycle

 an interval during which a recurring sequence of events occurs; a bicycle or motorcycle

synonym: revolution, rotation, bike

(1) the **cycle** of the seasons, (2) go to the workplace by **cycle** 

The food chain causes a material cycle.

### passive

adj. characterized by a lack of activity or initiative; not actively participating or engaging in something; marked by a tendency to accept things without resistance or opposition

synonym: inactive, lethargic, apathetic

(1) **passive** response, (2) **passive** vocabulary

The **passive** approach taken by the government towards climate change is concerning.

### aggressive

adj. behaving in an angry, energetic, or threatening way towards another person; tending to spread quickly

synonym: assertive, combative, threatening

### playlist

 a curated list of songs or audio recordings that can be played in a specific order or shuffled randomly, often created for a specific purpose or event

#### balance

 a condition in which everything has the same weight or force; something left after other parts have been taken away

#### frown

v. to make an angry or severe expression by bringing your eyebrows together to indicate disapproval, displeasure, or concentration

#### argue

v. to express differing opinions or points of view, often in a heated or contentious manner; to present a case or reasoning to persuade or convince others

#### crazy

adj. stupid or not sensible; very angry

### compile

#### exhaustive

adj. comprehensive and thorough; totally complete; leaving no stone unturned

synonym: thorough, complete, comprehensive

pet

- an animal that you have at home as a companion and treated kindly
- (1) a pet bird, (2) a teacher's pet

I have a parrot as a **pet**.

peeve

v. to annoy or irritate someone; to be a source of annoyance or irritation to someone; (noun) something that irritates or annoys you; a source of annoyance or irritation

synonym: annoy, irritate, bother

(1) personal **peeve**, (2) **peeve** me off when people talk loudly

Nothing **peeves** me more than being lied to.

hint

 an indirect suggestion; a slight but appreciable amount of something

synonym: clue, indication, suggestion

faint

adj. not strong, clear, or vigorous; slight or weak
synonym: slight, vague, soft

whiff

 a brief and faint odor that is detected; a slight gust or puff of air; a hint or a trace of something; (verb) to catch a brief, slight smell of something

synonym: aroma, scent, odor

nostalgia

 a sentimental longing or wistful affection for a period in the past

#### session

 a formal meeting or series of meetings for the execution of a particular group's functions; a period spent doing a particular activity

### frequent

#### executive

#### whirlwind

 a very strong wind that moves rapidly in circles and causes a lot of damage

synonym: tornado, waterspout, dust devil

(1) economic **whirlwind**, (2) **whirlwind** of events We went on a **whirlwind** visit to the sightseeing spot.

#### ensue

v. to happen or follow as a result or consequence of something

synonym: follow, occur, result

(1) **ensue** within a few years, (2) predict what will **ensue** A power outage **ensued** after the storm knocked out the electricity.

### introductory

adj. intended as an introduction or preliminary; serving as a base or starting point

synonym: beginning, preliminary, initial

#### mess

 a state of confusion, dirtiness, or untidiness; (verb) to fail to do something or to make something dirty or untidy

#### **furious**
