sob

oxytocin

- a hormone secreted by the pituitary which stimulates contractions of the uterus during labor (= the process of pushing out a baby) and the ejection of milk
- (1) **oxytocin-degrading** enzyme, (2) **oxytocin** receptor Women may increase **oxytocin** production through romantic love.

flood

a large amount of water flowing beyond its normal limits;
 an overwhelming number or amount

synonym: deluge, downpour, overflow

These heavy rains caused flash **floods** on several islands.

nurse

 a healthcare professional who is trained to provide care for the sick or injured; (verb) to try to cure by special care or treatment of an illness or injury

synonym: healthcare worker, caregiver, medic

 The night shift nurse checked my vital signs before

administering the medication.

fierce

adj. severe and violent in a way that is frightening synonym: ferocious, convulsive, forceful

adj. covered in or smeared with blood; involving or characterized by bloodshed or brutality

imperfectly

adv. in a faulty or incomplete way

enormous

courtyard

n. an open space surrounded by buildings or walls, often in the center of a building or group of buildings

hell

n. the place thought to be where bad people go and are punished after death, often depicted as being located beneath the earth; an extraordinarily unpleasant or difficult place synonym: inferno, agony, misery

Christ

 n. the man that Christians believe is the prophet and the son of God, and whose life and sermons form the basis for Christianity

guru

 a spiritual teacher or leader, notably in Hindu and Sikh traditions; a person who has knowledge and expertise in a particular area

faith

 n. complete trust in something or someone's ability or knowledge; a strong belief in religion, divine power, etc.

refuse

- v. to show that one is not willing to do or accept something synonym: turn down, deny, decline

warrior

n. a person who engaged in or experienced warfare, especially in the past

saint

 a person who is recognized as having an exceptional degree of holiness, virtue, or devotion

synonym: holy person, martyr, angel

abandon

- v. to leave a place, thing, or person with no intention of returning; (noun) a feeling of extreme emotional intensitysynonym: relinquish, leave behind, disregard

empire

mount

v. to increase, go up, or advance gradually or continuously; to prepare and supply with the necessary equipment for execution or performance; to ride on something or someone

Don

- a Spanish gentleman; a university lecturer, especially a senior member of a college at Oxford or Cambridge
- (1) the **don** of the university, (2) **Don** Giovanni He could never go against what **Don** Carlos said.

turban

 a headdress consisting of a long piece of cloth wound around the head and sometimes the face

synonym: headwrap, headscarf, headcloth

(1) turban on head, (2) turban shell

The man wore a **turban** as part of his traditional cultural attire.

braid

n. a complex pattern, design, or plait formed out of three or more strands, often used decoratively in hair, clothing, or textiles; threads of silk, cotton, or other material attached to clothes, uniforms, or other things made of cloth, as a decoration

synonym: plait, twist, weave

(1) braid hair, (2) elastic cord braid

She always wore her hair in a single **braid** down her back.

fast-forward

v. to advance or move forward in time or progress, particularly in a rapid or accelerated manner; to increase the playback speed of a recording

twin

- either of two children born at the same time from the same mother

horror

 intense fear or disgust, especially at something shocking or terrifying

synonym: fear, terror, dread

(1) horror movie, (2) horror-struck look

The stories of war crimes filled her with **horror**.

stick

v. to put something, usually a sharp object, into something; to restrict yourself to doing or using one certain thing and not change; (noun) a thin piece of wood or other material

synonym: pierce, adhere, stay

(1) stick a key in a lock, (2) fire stick

You **stick** a bill in the change machine, and the coins pop out.

flash

a sudden intense burst of radiant energy; a momentary brightness

synonym: sparkle, gleam, glimmer

These heavy rains caused **flash** floods on several islands.

beard

 hair that grows on a man's face, often around the mouth and chin

synonym: facial hair, whiskers, stubble

(1) a black **beard**, (2) shave my **beard**

He grew a thick **beard** to change his appearance.

nation

 a large organized community of people living in a particular country or region and having a particular culture

synonym: country, state, sovereign entity

(1) nation-state, (2) a seafaring nation

The **nation** of Japan is known for its unique culture and advanced technology.

represent

v. to speak, act, or be present on behalf of another person or group; to form or constitute

synonym: depict, express, describe

(1) **represent** by a diagram, (2) the characters that **represent** numbers

We elected him to **represent** us at the international conference.

commitment

 a promise or firm decision to do something or to behave in a certain way

synonym: burden, obligation, promise

(1) a **commitment** to an alliance, (2) meet his **commitments**

His business **commitments** took him to the United States.

cast

v. to cause light or shadow to appear on a surface; to assing or choose someone such as an actor or representative, especially by selection process

synonym: throw, project, select

(1) cast a ballot, (2) cast a charming eye

This accident **cast** a dark shadow over their lives.

murder

n. the crime of killing somebody intentionallysynonym: slaying, killing

synonym. Slaying, kining

patriot

 a person who loves their nation and would fight for it if required

synonym: nationalist, loyalist

widow

a woman whose spouse has died and who has not remarried

synonym: bereaved

blame

memorial

a structure or monument to commemorate a person or event

degree

shield

 a unit of measurement for angles, temperature, or level of proficiency or achievement; a rank or level of academic or professional attainment

synonym: level, qualification, diploma

 She received her **degree** in psychology from the university.
- a protective covering or structure, especially in the past, that soldiers held in front of their bodies to protect themselves

synonym: guard, protection, safeguard

(1) a heat **shield**, (2) a **shield** for protecting against a bullet Lead is an effective **shield** against X-rays, gamma rays, and other harmful radiation.

advocate

 a person who supports or suggests an idea, development, or way of doing something

synonym: proponent, exponent, promoter

Advocates of abolishing the death penalty often argue that the alternative heaviest sentence should be life in prison.

supermax

 adj. used to describe a high-security prison designed to house the most dangerous inmates, often characterized by strict confinement, reduced privileges, and intense surveillance

synonym: high-security, maximum-security, ultra-high-security

A **supermax** prison is designed to house the most dangerous inmates.

shore

 the land along the edge of a sea, lake, broad river, or other large body of water; (verb) to support by placing against something solid or rigid

mass

 a large amount of a substance with no definite shape or form; a large number of people or things grouped or crowded together

lawsuit

 a legal action taken by one party against another in a court of law, typically seeking damages or some other form of remedy for perceived wrongs or harms suffered

nationalist

movement

globe

presidency

n. the office or term of the President of a country or organization

synonym: leadership, administration, governance

statistics

- n. the discipline that concerns the collection, organization, analysis, interpretation, and presentation of data

supremacy

the state, condition, or position of being superior to all others in authority, power, or status

synonym: dominance, superiority, preeminence

neighboring states.

march

to walk militarily with stiff, regular steps

synonym: parade

torch

a portable device that produces a flame, typically one n. that is used to light a fire or a candle

synonym: flashlight, lantern, flare

hood

a covering for the head and neck, especially one attached to a garment

synonym: hoodie, cowl, cloak

reckon

to think or believe something

synonym: regard, imagine, suppose

criminal

a person who has committed a crime

detain

 to keep someone in official custody; to prevent them from leaving

synonym: hold, keep, detainment

deport

- v. to force someone to leave a country, typically on the grounds of illegal status or for having committed a crime
 synonym: expel, banish, repatriate
- (1) **deport** a refugee, (2) **deport** dissidents from the party The government has decided to **deport** illegal immigrants back to their home countries.

imprison

v. to confine a person to a prison, a detention facility, or a place of involuntary confinement

sacrifice

illusion

spot

decide

responsible

- adj. answerable or accountable for something within one's power, control, or management

heaven

judge

 a person who makes decisions in a court of law; (verb) to determine the result of or form a critical opinion of something

forgiveness

n. the act of stopping feeling angry or resentful towards someone for a mistake or offense with compassion

trigger

- v. to make something happen suddenly; to cause something such as a device, machine, etc. to function synonym: activate, spark, drive

aim

- v. to try or plan to get or achieve something synonym: aspire, direct, target

oppress
