synonym: orchestra, harmony, concert

apiece

adv. to, from, or by each one of a group synonym: each

(1) one **apiece**, (2) give two dollars **apiece**These toys are five dollars **apiece**.

industrious

adj. hardworking, diligent, and persistent in effortsynonym: diligent, hardworking, assiduous

synonym: frighten, threaten, terrify
