creep

sigh

admittedly

adv. used to acknowledge a fact or statement, often one that weakens or contradicts an argument or opinion; concededly

mushy

adj. soft and pulpy in texture or consistency, often describing food; emotionally sentimental or overly romantic in a way that can be seen as insincere or sickly sweet synonym: sappy, sentimental

The cake was **mushy** because I accidentally added too much milk to the batter.

greedy

adj. having or showing an intense or insatiable desire for wealth, status, power, or food

rage

n. a strong feeling of anger or violence

synonym: fury, anger, outrage

steady

bubble

 a thin, round, and often transparent mass of gas that is surrounded by a thin layer of liquid; a state of economic or social prosperity that is unsustainable and eventually collapses

increasingly

adv. more and more

synonym: more and more, progressively

overflow

v. to flow or run over the edge or brim of a container or surface; to be more than enough

synonym: spill, inundate, flood

cruel

adj. feeling or showing pleasure in causing pain or suffering to others

spoil

- v. to ruin the taste, appearance, or quality of something; to become or cause something to become rotten or bad

alert

v. to warn or arouse to a sense of danger; (adjective) paying close attention or being in a state of readiness for action

psychology

- n. the scientific study of mind and behavior

pioneer

develop

v. to grow or expand; to improve or refine through a process of progress and refinement, often to achieve greater sophistication or complexity; to elaborate or add detail to something that is in the process of being created

synonym: evolve, progress, advance

(1) develop a strategy, (2) develop a skill

We must **develop** a new system to streamline our workflow and increase efficiency.

prejudice

 a thought or feeling that is unfair and makes no sense, mainly when it is formed without enough thought or knowledge

synonym: bias, preconception, predisposition

genocide

the intentional killing of a large group of people,
 especially those of a particular ethnic group or nation

interaction

accident

an unfortunate event, especially one causing damage or injury

synonym: calamity, casualty, chance

gay

adj. homosexual; happy, carefree
synonym: cheerful, lively, joyful

(1) gay couple, (2) gay rights

The **gay** pride parade was a celebration of diversity and acceptance.

consciously

adv. with awareness; in a deliberate mannersynonym: intentionally, deliberately, knowingly

consciously aware of a problem, (2) act consciously
 consciously criticizes her in the publicity.

discriminate

v. to treat a person or particular group of people worse or better than another, especially in an unfair way; to recognize or perceive the difference between people or things

synonym: show prejudice, segregate, differentiate

- (1) discriminate against women employees,
- (2) discriminate between different things

You should not discriminate against minorities.

policy

a set of rules, guidelines, principles, or procedures that govern decision-making or action, often used in the context of business or government; a course of action or plan of action adopted or followed by an organization or individual to achieve a goal or objective

synonym: strategy, plan, guideline

The company's new **policy** on remote work has made it a more inclusive workplace.

coincidence

 an occasion when two or more similar things happen at the same time by chance, in a surprising way

synonym: co-occurrence, concurrency, accident

It was a pure **coincidence** that we met her in the library.

define

 to state or explain precisely the nature, scope, or meaning of something

synonym: characterize, depict, express

(1) define a word, (2) define my position

To advance this discussion, we must **define** "success" rigorously.

broad

adj. very wide; general

synonym: wide, expansive, comprehensive

(1) attract broad attention, (2) a broad mind

He accumulated wealth across a **broad** spectrum of assets.

extreme

adj. very great in amount or degree

synonym: farthermost, outermost, fierce

(1) **extreme** sports, (2) **extreme** weather events

Solar gravity creates **extreme** pressures and temperatures.

instance

n. a particular example or single occurrence of something

synonym: example, sample, illustration

(1) for instance, (2) notable instance

These articles cite five **instances** of climate change.

march

v. to walk militarily with stiff, regular steps

synonym: parade

(1) march against the war, (2) march east

The troops marched shoulder-to-shoulder.

chant

 a simple melody or tune, typically one that is repeated or sung in a monotonous way; (verb) recite with musical intonation

synonym: hymn, mantra, (verb) recite

(1) chant melodies, (2) chant in the chapel

The soccer game crowd broke into a chant of "Go, team, go!"

gender

n. the range of characteristics of femininity and masculinity and differentiating between them, especially when considering social and cultural differences rather than differences in biology

synonym: sexuality

(1) gender-blind policies, (2) dual gender

Cultural norms strongly influence **gender** expectations.

inferior

adj. lower in rank, status, or quality

synonym: lower, subordinate, secondary

implicit

adj. suggested but not directly expressed synonym: implied, unstated, hinted

historic

adj. famous or significant in history, or potentially so synonym: memorable, momentous, historical

racism

n. prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against a person or people based on their membership in a particular ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized

synonym: prejudice, discrimination, bias

(1) systemic **racism**, (2) research on anti- **racism**The school's lack of diversity was a clear indication of the **racism** present in the community.

infect

v. to affect a person, an animal, or a plant with a disease-causing organism

synonym: pollute, contaminate, affect

(1) **infect** other animal species, (2) **infect** a computer with a virus

Children often infect parents with this head cold.

punch

v. to strike someone or something with one's fist; to make a hole in something

synonym: hit, strike, slap

(1) punch out numbers, (2) punch a ticketHe punched the wall in anger.

enlightened

adj. having or showing a rational, modern, and well-informed outlook

synonym: educated, informed, aware

(1) **enlightened** age, (2) make an **enlightened** decision The **enlightened** teacher taught the class about the importance of compassion and empathy.

racist

adj. characterized by or showing discrimination or prejudice against people of other races; (noun) a person with a prejudiced belief that one racial group is superior to others

synonym: discriminatory, prejudiced, bigoted

(1) far-right racist, (2) racist attitudes

The **racist** comments made by the politician caused widespread condemnation.

deserve

v. to be worthy of or entitled to something, especially something good or valuable

synonym: merit, earn, justify

(1) **deserve** respect, (2) **deserve** this prize

The employee **deserved** the promotion for their hard work and dedication.

abstract

adj. based on general ideas, feelings, or qualities and not on any a physical or concrete existence

synonym: conceptual, theoretical, ideational

(1) an abstract noun, (2) abstract science

The invention of the camera triggered the development of **abstract** painting.

generic

adj. not specific; not linked to a particular brand or product *synonym*: common, ordinary, typical

(1) a **generic** product, (2) **generic** version

The **generic** aspirin brand was just as effective as the name brand but much cheaper.

sanctimonious

adj. characterized by excessive or hypocritical holiness or righteousness, often to show off one's supposed moral superiority

synonym: hypocritical, pharisaical, insincere

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(1) **sanctimonious** attitude, (2) **sanctimonious** speech She accused her boss of being a **sanctimonious** hypocrite.

pedestal

a base or support on which something, typically a statue, column, etc., is placed

synonym: base, stand, platform

(1) pedestal sink, (2) a stone pedestal

The statue was placed on a **pedestal** in the center of the park.

manifestation

 a visible or tangible form of something, especially a particular sign of a disease or condition

synonym: expression, embodiment, presentation

(1) **manifestation** of a deeper problem, (2) **manifestation** of psychological stress

The **manifestation** of his anxiety was evident in his shaking hands.

essential

adj. indispensable; fundamental

synonym: critical, crucial, basic

fundamental

adj. forming an essential base or core from which everything else develops or is affected

synonym: basic, essential, entire

military

adj. relating to or characteristic of members of the armed forces; of or relating to war or warfare

synonym: armed, martial, warlike

(1) a military operation, (2) a military leader

The **military** academy was known for its strict discipline and training.

convoy

 a group of vehicles, ships, or other vessels that travel together, often for protection or mutual support; (verb) to accompany or escort a person or group while traveling

synonym: caravan, procession, escort

(1) convoy of trucks, (2) naval convoy

The military **convoy** cautiously traveled through the desert, watching for any signs of danger.

grenade

 a hand-held explosive device designed to be thrown or projected toward a target and detonate upon impact or after a specified time

synonym: bomb, explosive, shrapnel

(1) grenade explosion, (2) smoke grenade

The soldier threw a **grenade** to destroy the enemy's bunker.

fortunate

adj. having good luck or luckysynonym: fortuitous, lucky, blessed

holocaust

the systematic killing of millions of Jews and other minority groups by the Nazis during World War II, or any similar act of mass destruction

myth

 an ancient story or set of stories accepted as history, especially explaining the worldview of a people

synonym: fable, legend, lore

(1) the **myth** of an old religion, (2) perpetuate a **myth** With the financial bubble bursting, the **myth** of economic growth in investment banking collapsed.

Jewish

adj. of or relating to people whose traditional religion is Judaism synonym: Judaic

(1) **Jewish** history, (2) **Jewish** culture

My friend is a **Jewish** woman who celebrates Hanukkah every year.

degree

 a unit of measurement for angles, temperature, or level of proficiency or achievement; a rank or level of academic or professional attainment

synonym: level, qualification, diploma

(1) bachelor's **degree**, (2) **degree** centigrade

She received her **degree** in psychology from the university.

overcome

v. to succeed in controlling or dealing with something, such as a problem or difficulty; to defeat or overwhelm someone

synonym: beat, confound, overwhelm

- demean

 v. to lower or damage someone's dignity, honor, or reputation; to treat someone disrespectfully, often in a way that makes them feel inferior or humiliated

humanize

 to make something or someone more humane or compassionate; to make something more relatable or understandable to humans

destine

v. to determine or set the course of something in advance, often in a way that seems predetermined or inevitable;

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to specify or choose someone or something for a particular fate or outcome

Some people believe that we are all **destined** for greatness.

womb

 the organ of a woman or female mammal in which a baby develops before birth

synonym: uterus, matrice

republican

n. a person who supports or advocates for a particular form of government, typically one that has an elected head of state rather than a monarch; a member or supporter of the Republican Party in the United States

recognize

overnight
